


This isn't so much about how you got started, although that's OK too, but rather: *What do you like about amateur radio, what aspects keep you interested?*

Thanks to our treasurer, Goetz Brandt K6GKB, for supplying this first installment.

And now, without further ado...

Amateur radio is not just one hobby, but a myriad of hobbies cloaked under one name. Most obviously it deals with electronics and those educated in this field of physics make the greatest contributions. But there are opportunities for Luddite like myself to join the ranks and enjoy others in the fun.


So what part of the sport attracts me? Well, there's all that gorgeous equipment one can buy. Transceivers, amplifiers, antenna switches, antennas, antenna towers, rotators, power supplies, and the list goes on. Much like buying a new car, or remodeling the kitchen, there can be great satisfaction in watching a plan come together.

My first station was a mobile rig in a motel. I was on temporary duty in Garden Grove California where my company supplied me with a gorgeous suite, two divided large rooms on the second floor and at the end of the compound. My ICOM 706MKIIG sat on a beside stand and was powered by a motorcycle battery that was on continuous trickle charge. The antenna was a cut to length dipole that was hung from the front room window valance to the back room window valance and had its midpoint BALUN suspended from the interconnecting door jam. RG8 coax ran from the door jam to the bed stand.

As a new ham I was terrified at making my first contact. One afternoon after work I overheard some people talking round table and I squeaked in the word "BREAK" during a pause in their chatter. To my surprise, an almost instant response, "Who is the Breaker?" I meekly volunteered my call sign and was immediately invited to become a member of their group. I can't tell you what a friendly bunch I joined that afternoon. One member in Saskatoon, one in Temecula California, one in the state of Washington and yet another in Alaska to mention just a few. Thereafter, every afternoon for several years to come I would join in and share whatever trivial event had occurred that day.

After twelve years of this on the road life I returned to my home in San Jose and began building a permanent station. It consists of two duplicate ICOM IC-775DSP transceivers, two ICOM IC-4KL amplifiers, and an ICOM EX-627 antenna switch that connects to my antenna farm. My property is large enough to accommodate full length dipoles for the lower bands and a forty foot tower supports a HYGAIN TH3-MK4 three element beam which sits on a HYGAIN CD4511 rotator. The beauty of this setup is that when I waltz from one band to another, sweep a band from edge to edge for signals, everything automatically follows my selections. Even the correct antenna gets connected and matched without me doing anything to help.

So what do I do with all this equipment? I participate in the morning Rhubarb Net. It starts at 9:30AM, the net controller takes check ins and then we go through the list twice. Members are located all over the far west and many are consistent contributors while others pop in and out over time. On occasion, as many as 20 people check in, several are members of our own SCCARA. There is nothing too trivial to bring up, but mostly the subjects are quite interesting. The beauty of this type of rag chewing is that we are all equals, regardless of our electronic or other competencies. So join us, you'll enjoy sharing with the group.

Radio Amateurs of Canada Announces a New Section

The number of Sections needed for a clean sweep in the ARRL November Sweepstakes (SS) will rise to 84 in 2020, with the addition of a new Prince Edward Island (PE) Section. Radio Amateurs of Canada (RAC) has announced that the new Section will become effective on April 1.

Prince Edward Island has been in the Maritimes (MAR) Section. RAC said its Prince Edward Island members have been working for some time to create a separate Section for RAC ARES activities there. The provinces of Nova Scotia and New Brunswick will remain in the Maritimes Section.

In addition to Field Day and Sweepstakes, the new Section in Canada will affect the ARRL 160-Meter Contest but not the ARRL 10-Meter Contest, which uses individual states/provinces for US and Canadian multipliers. The change will mean that logging software developers will have to update their software to include the PE Section as a valid exchange element for any affected operating events.

RAC also announced an adjustment in two of its Ontario Sections. Effective April 1, radio amateurs in the City of Hamilton and in the

Regional Municipality of Niagara will shift to the Greater Toronto Area (GTA) Section from the Ontario South (ONS) Section.

China Telecoms Regulator Proposing to Delete Some Current Amateur Allocations

China's telecommunications regulator has proposed amending the Measures for the Administration of Amateur Radio Stations, and some amateur bands are in danger of being eliminated. Lide Zhang, BI8CKU, told ARRL that the proposal would prohibit amateur operation on the 2200-meter band as well as on 146 - 148 MHz, 1260 - 1300 MHz, 3400 - 3500 MHz, 5650 - 5725 MHz, and all bands above 10 GHz.

Radio communications engineer and Chinese Amateur Satellite Group (CAMSAT) CEO Alan Kung, BA1DU, told ARRL that government efforts to eliminate some amateur bands are nothing new, but proposals that have been aired for a while now are on the regulatory agency's schedule. Kung said he does not anticipate that all of the bands proposed will be taken away, but he conceded that the climate will "undoubtedly" become increasingly more dangerous for China's amateur radio community.

"The attempt to crowd out the amateur radio bands has a long history throughout the world," he said, "but it may never have become so urgent for the amateur radio community as it is today. We all understand that radio spectrum resources have become a bottleneck for further development." He said today's radio communication industry "is working hard to share spectrum resources."

Kung characterized spectrum as "the soil on which amateur radio depends."

An international team of 10 operators will be active as W8S from Swains Island from March 10 to March 25.

The DXpedition team will be active on all HF bands on CW, SSB, FT8, and RTTY. Operation will be from two separate camps on the island -- a Red Camp and a Blue Camp -- each with two stations. The four stations will be on the air 24/7. The station equipment complements are identical. Two stations will be dedicated for 160 and 80 meters. A WiFi network will link the Red and Blue camps to network all logging laptops. Hans Griessl, DL6JGN, and Ronald Stuy, PA3EWP, are co-leaders. Swains Island (Olohega) is an atoll in the Tokelau chain. Swains is a US territory and considered part of American Samoa. Swains Island is the 34th most-wanted DXCC entity, according to Club Log.
