

RS-BA1

Through the miracle of trickle down economics I have become the owner of an ICOM IC-7800 transceiver.



Originally introduced in 2003, the radio cost \$10,600 when introduced, that's \$16,655 in today's dollars. Having paid \$3,000, a bit of a budget stretch, I am enjoying one of ham radios greatest transceivers. It eventually morphed into the IC-7850 and more recently the IC-7851, ICOM's current flagship radio.

I won't go into all the features of this radio which can be viewed on the internet, but I will focus on one feature I have made use of. The radio has enough internal PC functionality as part of its circuitry so that a LAN cable can be connected to an RJ-45 socket provided on the rear panel. And here the fun begins.



Using ICOM's RS-BA1 Internet Protocol Remote Control Software, you can talk to the radio using Microsoft Windows. What appears on your display is a picture of your radio with all the controls, most of which can be manipulated with your mouse or touch screen.

Why would you want to do this? In its simplest implementation you might want to join a ham radio net that meets during your breakfast meal. If the shack and the breakfast nook are

at opposite ends of the house, you can munch away on sausage and eggs in front of a PC and be part of the round table. With this arrangement all your communications take place internally or on your side of your internet provider's router. Here is the coup de grâce! You can do this from the outside of your router, literally from anywhere you have internet access. You can use your radio from any hotel/motel, McDonalds or RV park

If you were in my shack while I am on vacation you

If you were in my shack while I am on vacation you would see the IC-7800 turned off, but with the lighted power button blinking its orange light. This means the radio is in standby mode listening for instructions from the LAN cable. When I remotely mouse the power button on the PC radio display, the radio back home turns on, wakes up the IC-4KL Amplifier and picks the correct antenna using ICOM's EX-627 antenna switch. I can tune the radio to any band and any frequency which is clear or join an already existing QSO. When I remotely turn the radio off, everything shuts down in the shack and only the negligible standby current of the IC-7800 is flowing.

Is that great or what?

USA ARDF Championships Results

The results are in for the 21st USA Championships in Amateur Radio Direction Finding (ARDF). The 4 days of competitions were held from April 7 - 10 in Prince William Forest Park (PWFP) in northern Virginia. The competition results will help determine the makeup of ARDF Team USA at the 20th ARDF World Championships, set for September 2022 in Serbia.

Thirty participants competed in categories for men and women ranging in age from 15 to 70+. All the competitive events were held within PWFP, on maps provided by the Quantico Orienteering Club (QOC) of Quantico, Virginia. In an innovative approach, the Backwoods Orienteering Klub (BOK) of Raleigh, North Carolina, organized and sponsored the event across state lines, applying the Raleigh group's ARDF knowledge and experience to a beautiful new venue.

After a day of practice, the races began on April 7, with the fast-paced sprint event in which two sets of five transmitters operating on two different 80-meter frequencies transmit sequentially in 12-second bursts every minute. "The course was hillier than typical for this event. Nevertheless, none of the finishers exceeded the 60-minute time limit," noted Event Director Joseph Huberman, K5JGH.

Other events included:

Foxoring -- This event followed the next day. Foxoring is a timed race in which individual competitors use a topographic map and a magnetic compass to navigate through diverse, wooded terrain while searching for radio transmitters (foxes).

2-Meter Classic -- This involves locating up to five transmitters on courses of up to 12 kilometers in length. Course lengths and the number of foxes are adjusted for different age and gender categories, so that men, women, youth, and seniors, can traverse courses designed to be appropriate for their capabilities.

80-Meter Classic -- This is conducted much like the 2-Meter

Classic, but without the reflections and multipath propagation that are often observed at VHF frequencies.

US competitors in the six International Amateur Radio Union (IARU) categories for men aged 19 - 70 and women aged 19 - 65, are under consideration for membership in the US team for the 2022 ARDF Championships. Up to three competitors in each age and gender category and competition format may be on a national team.

Vibroplex Acquires SPE Expert Linear Amplifiers

Vibroplex LLC, of Knoxville, Tennessee, has entered into a purchase agreement to acquire all operating assets related to the sale and servicing of SPE Expert linear amplifiers from Expert Linears America LLC, of Magnolia, Texas, for undisclosed terms. This is including contractual agreements for the exclusive sale and service of SPE Expert amplifiers for the United States and Canada. SPE, based in Rome, Italy, has also agreed to provide an extension to existing distribution agreements as part of the transaction. Vibroplex has taken over the exclusive US and Canada distribution and service of SPE Expert products effective May 1, 2022.

Present ELA LLC owner Bob Hardie, W5UQ, told ARRL, "I'm still doing a lot of the repairing, and I will be for a few years until I just can't repair anymore." Hardie will continue to provide repair and parts services for SPE Expert products on behalf of Vibroplex and function as a consultant during the transition to new ownership. An additional repair person has also been brought on by ELA and Vibroplex to assist with both future warranty and non-warranty service and tech support.

All SPE amplifier warranties presently in effect will be transferred to and administered by Vibroplex. Pending orders for SPE Expert unfulfilled prior to May 1, 2022, will be administered by Vibroplex with no additional delay over quoted delivery time added.

SPE is owned and operated by Gianfranco Scasciafratti, I0ZY, of Rome, Italy. The current SPE product line is distributed worldwide and consists of the SPE 1.3K-FA, SPE 1.5K-FA, and SPE 2K-FA solid-state linear amplifiers.

Scott Robbins, W4PA, owns Vibroplex, as well as Bencher, INRAD, Par EndFedz and Vintage Manuals product lines. The company is also the exclusive US and Canada distributor for Spiderbeam, MAT-TUNER, Easy-Rotor-Control, GHD, and Hi-Mound radio accessories.

This month Goetz K6GKB gave us an interesting article about his recent radio purchase. The key feature he liked was the ability to use the radio remotely from *anywhere* over the internet,

I believe radios like this, and especially digital radios (which also have remote interfaces) represent a fundamental change. The invention of the "valve" (radio tube) was also a fundamental change.

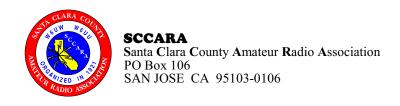
Some may say the transistor and integrated circuit were fundamental changes too, but those really only made improvements, the radios weren't fundamentally different. They still have the same analog circuits and worked the same way. However, if you look inside a digital radio, you won't see analog filters and tuned circuits, those are now mathematical constructs in software.

Goetz ended by asking: "Is that great or what?" Well, it's more than that, it's fundamental!

These new radios are quite expensive (as Goetz made clear) and thus not widely used... *yet*. The prices will have to fall significantly before we see how it affects amateur radio. No doubt the new radios will be more capable. However, will they make us better operators?
