2023 SET Exercise to Test Skills and Emergency Preparedness

The ARRL Simulated Emergency Test (SET) is scheduled for October 7 - 8, 2023.

The SET is ARRL's annual national emergency exercise designed to assess the skills and preparedness of Amateur Radio Emergency Service® (ARES®) volunteers, as well as those affiliated with other organizations involved in emergency and disaster responses. The SET is open to all radio amateurs and partner organizations, in addition to national, state, and local officials. Besides ARES volunteers, those active in the National Traffic System (NTS), Radio Amateur Civil Emergency Service (RACES), National Weather Service's SKYWARN® Storm Spotter program, Community Emergency Response Team (CERT), and a variety of other allied groups and public service-oriented radio amateurs are needed to fulfill important roles in this nationwide exercise.

During the exercise, volunteers can assess equipment, modes, and skills under simulated emergency conditions and scenarios. Individuals can use the time to update a go-kit for use during deployments and to ensure their home station's operational capability during an emergency or disaster.

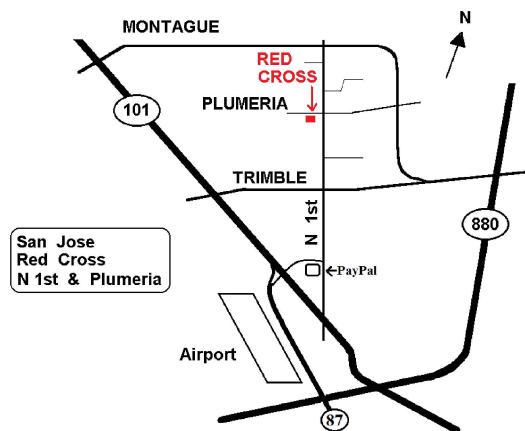

During the week of October 16, they'll conduct a series of high-power HF information transmissions on 60 meters and channel 1 (5330.5 kHz). This event will coincide with the ARRL SET.

Director Lou WA6QYS or someone else might open the station due to Don K6PBQ's broken water pipe (see Health & Welfare).

SCCARA's 2 meter net continues to be every Monday at 7:30 PM on the W6UU repeater.

SCCARA continues to run the 10 Meter Net every Thursday at 8:00 PM at frequency 28.385 MHz.

Health & Welfare: Station Trustee Don K6PBQ had a water pipe break in his home when he was on vacation. He's hired some workers to fix it, but it's been complicated due to the presence of asbestos in his house.

Editor Gary WB6YRU: I've printed out more of the 100 Year Anniversary SCCARA-GRAMs if anyone wants them.

Secretary Truman N6TRU: I'd like to contribute some digital files from SCCARA's archive to the Special Collections department at the Martin Luther King Jr. Library in San Jose. I'm unsure if they take digital files or are interested, so I'll update a bit later.

Editor Gary WB6YRU: Digital files would be very easy to contribute. The archives aren't fully digitized, it's a work in progress.

Also, there's a museum in South San Jose that apparently has one of SCCARA's radios from the 1950s through a 99-year loan. I found out about this through a correspondence letter in the SCCARA archives. I don't know more than that, I could dig that

letter out.

Vice President John W6JPP: There was a break-in with SCCARA's antenna trailer at the American Legion. We'll need to repair the damage. We're considering replacing the string tie-downs with steel cables.

Editor Gary WB6YRU: We should add some "No Trespassing" signs onto the trailer.

Vice President John W6JPP: I don't think a sign would be a deterrent. According to the police, there's enough signage.

Editor Gary WB6YRU: A few months ago, Lou WA6QYS asked me about a keyer. According to the property list, Ned AC6YY has it. But Ned said he brought it to SCCARA's club station. We looked for it at the club station, but couldn't find it. We did find some other keys and paddles that were not on the property list; they were added.

Vice President John W6JPP: We should do another inventory at some point soon.

Editor Gary WB6YRU: If we used it during Field Day, maybe the programmable keyer could have gone home with someone mistakenly.

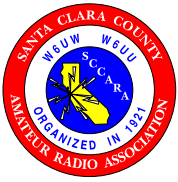
Newsletter Notes

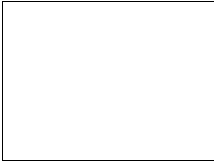
