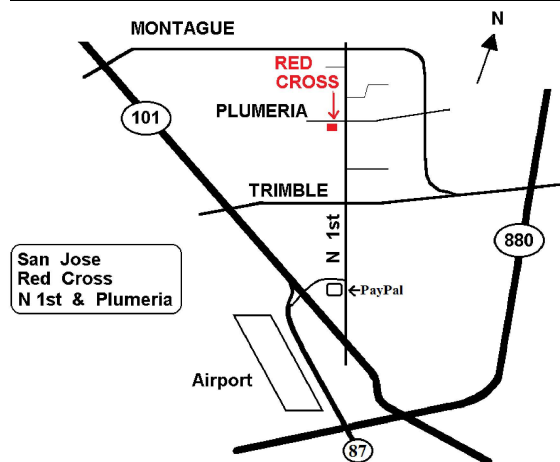

## ARRL News

### New Technician Class Question Pool Released -- Effective July 1, 2026

On December 18, 2025, the [National Conference of Volunteer Examiner Coordinators](#) (NCVEC) Question Pool Committee (QPC) released the revised 2026-2030 Technician Class (Element 2) question pool. It will be required for all Amateur Radio License exam sessions beginning July 1, 2026. The new pool includes 409 questions (27 new, 30 removed, and about 155 modified), compared to 412 in the prior pool. The pool also includes three diagrams used for some of the questions.

This updated question pool incorporates significant changes compared to the prior pool. The questions were checked for technical accuracy and relevance to current amateur radio practices, as well as for grammar, syntax, format, clarity, and for redundancy within and between the pools.

VECs and Volunteer Examiners must use test designs based on the new pool starting on July 1, 2026. Current ARRL VEC Technician Class exam booklets (2022 series) and computer-generated Technician Class exams created from the 2022 question pool are valid until June 30. After that, old versions should be destroyed.

ARRL will have new editions of Technician Class study materials, including *The ARRL Ham Radio License Manual*, Gordon West

Technician Class License Prep book, and ARRL's Tech Q&A, by May 2026.

#### Announcements:

Gregg KF6FNA:

The board meeting will April 20 on our 2 m repeater right after the Monday night net. The club station will be open Saturday April 25 from roughly 10 am to 4 pm.

We will be hosting the electronic flea market, July 11. It runs from 6 am to 12 noon. We'll need volunteers.

Discussion on a coax patch panel for connecting antennas to radios at the club station.

Gary WB6YRU: I'll draw up a diagram on a way to go (without needing 90 degree adapters).

Ned AC6YY: We have a new radio, Icom 7300. It needs to be programmed, I'll do that. It has a built-in sound card and CAT interface for digital modes.

John W6JPP and I went to the DX Convention in Santa Maria (near Pismo Beach). It was like a regular convention with presentations on different subjects.

We now have only one person who can reliably open the radio room. We need to work on that.

Gregg KF6FNA: We have a new tower and rotator (which needs to be checked out) with a 3-element beam. We'll select a date to work on installing it.

John W6JPP: Our antenna trailer is being stored at the American Legion. We're responsible for up-keep of the area around the trailer. I'm having some medical issues, so I may not always be easy to contact. (we wish him well)

Ned AC6YY: I'm getting the parts we need for our project meeting, for making baluns. They should be able to handle up to 100 W. We likely will be asking participants to chip in for the costs.

Gary WB6YRU: We need to spell out the details in the SCCARA-GRAM well in advance.

Gregg KF6FNA: Our May general meeting is when we'll have our project meeting.

We need info about HF Winlink at the club station, a "how-to" sheet next to the radio and an article in the newsletter.

Gary WB6YRU: Get the details to me and I'll print it up.

Gary WB6YRU gave a short show-and-tell presentation about a set-up for testing and experimenting with toroid cores. Showed that bifilar windings perform much better than ordinary separate windings. We'll be using toroids at our project meeting next

month.

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## Newsletter Notes

Remember at the February meeting Ned talked about balun transformers? Well, at the May meeting you'll get a chance to make one!

Nothing was submitted about the May meeting so I don't have all the details, but what do I know is it will be a **project meeting**. Attendees will be able to make a balun transformer for antenna matching. The club will supply the parts and guidance.

Basically we'll be winding toroid transformers. They're all made from a ferrite toroid core with wire windings. They use the same parts, what makes them different is the configuration of the windings. One configuration will produce a **balun** (balanced to unbalanced) for matching your coax (unbalanced) to a dipole (balanced). Another common type is an **unun** (unbalanced to unbalanced) impedance transformer for matching to high-impedance random wire or end-fed antennas.

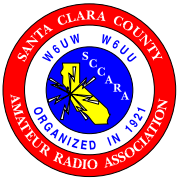
If this works out, we may have more project meetings. So, let us know what you think.

Until then, check out the "For the May Meeting" article with links to web sites. Those will give you an idea of what you might want to make and how.

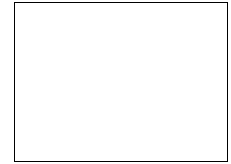
