

Students Talk To Shuttle Astronauts with Help from "Mr. Astronaut"

In a once in a lifetime opportunity, students at Fallbrook High School talked with the astronauts as they orbited Earth during the summer of 1995 on July 18. Stu-



dents established contact with the space shuttle Discovery via international ham radio. The contact was extremely successful thanks in part to Bill Dewey WD6AHW.

Having a successful contact with the space shuttle requires many hours of practice. Bill Dewey donated countless hours toward helping the students rehearse their questions to allow for a smooth delivery. They practiced using 2 meter radio will Bill in the next room playing the astronaut in outer space. Bill became affectionately nicknamed by the students, "Mr. Astronaut."

Thanks to Bill a variety of students were able to question the astronauts on their experiences in space travel and on the future of NASA's space

programs. In addition, the event was broadcast to class-rooms in session during summer school which enabled approximately 800 students to hear the excitement of the event. The response from the NASA officials after the event was that these students were the most well prepared students and asked some of the best questions. We know this was all thanks to Bill.

The experience was made possible by submitting the application to participate in the Shuttle Amateur Radio Experiment over two years before. The shuttle-to-school program, called SAREX, is a highly selective process. Through persistence, Fallbrook was selected. After five re-schedules due to delays in the launch, the program went off without a hitch on July 18.

A video recording of the event was presented at the September 11 meeting of the Board of Education. The following students were recognized by the Board of Trustees for their participation in the program: Jenny Steres, MaryJo Williams, Bethany Brock, Russell Spencer, Nate Golich, Vicky Gomez, Shannon Christopher, George Martinez, Aaron Ginoza, Carli Lutgendorf, Chris Lutgendorf and Andrew Swinton. Mr. Fritz Schattschneider was also recognized for his assistance and participation in the contact with the shuttle. Mr. Bill Dewey was especially recognized for his dedication and efforts.

Bill Dewey WD6AHW who became an SK on 10/24/02, was a great man of quality and honor. We shall miss him tremendously as he flies forever in our memories and transmits love to our hearts.

Possible SDDXC participation in the local Ham Radio Roundup on October 2d was discussed. Consensus was that there was not sufficient club interest to put together a presentation.

Secretary/Treasurer Harry, W6YOO, announced the schedule for the Challenger Middle School Special Event. The date will be Tuesday, January 28, 2003 from 8 AM to 4 PM. Amateur Radio operators are asked to volunteer some of their time by visiting the school during the special event. In addition to the station at the school, Harry, W6YOO will operate 20 meters from his home, and Joe, KC6QXU will operate 10 meters from his home in Valley Center. This Special Event is to commemorate the occasion of the Challenger Space Shuttle tragedy, which occurred on January 28, 1986.

CC&R Update!! (taken from ARRL Letter)

The only two Amateur Radio operators in the US House of Representatives as well as the sponsor and most cosponsors of the CC&R bill, HR 4720, were returned to office in this week's mid-term election. HR 4720 sponsor, Rep Steve Israel--a New York Democrat--beat back a challenge from Joseph Finley in that state's second congressional district. An original HR 4720 cosponsor, Texas Republican Rep Pete Sessions, of the 32nd congressional district, defeated Democratic challenger Pauline Dixon.

Elsewhere, Rep Greg Walden, WB7OCE, an Oregon Republican, handily won re-election in a three-way race in that state's second congressional district. Also re-elected was Arkansas fourth-district Democrat, Rep Mike Ross, WD5DVR, who defeated Republican Jay Dickey for another term. Walden and Ross are both HR 4720 cosponsors and the only hams in Congress.

Of the 34 HR 4720 cosponsors signed on to date, only three won't be back in January when the new Congress convenes. Although Rep Patsy Mink, the Hawaii Democrat died September 28, her name remained on the ballot, and she defeated Republican Bob McDermott. A special election will be held to fill the vacancy. Another cosponsor, Rep Bob Schaffer, a Colorado Republican, did not seek a new term, and a third, Maryland Republican Rep Constance Morella, was defeated for re-election by Democrat Christopher Van Hollen.

Although at least one "lame duck" session of Congress is scheduled between now and the time the new Congress convenes, action on HR 4720--"The Amateur Radio Emergency Communications Consistency Act"--is considered highly unlikely. Technically, the measure remains alive until Congress formally adjourns.

ARRL President Jim Haynie, W5JBP, has called HR 4720 "probably the most important thing the League has done in a long time." The League's effort to secure a congressional solution to the issue of CC&Rs--deed convenants, conditions and restrictions as they affect the ability of amateurs to erect outdoor antenna systems--will restart after the new Congress is gaveled into session in January.

The measure was referred to the House Telecommunications and Internet Subcommittee, to which Walden was appointed. It would require private land-use regulators-such as homeowners' associations--to "reasonably accommodate" Amateur Radio communication consistent with the PRB-1 limited federal preemption. PRB-1 now applies only to states and municipalities.

Jim Price, K6ZH, and Tony Arnold, K6MC, were part of the just-completed TK4Z CQ WW SSB operation from Corsica. They joined the globe-trotting bunch of Dick Norton, N6AA; Art Goddard, W6XD; Phil Goetz, N6ZZ; Larry Hammel, K5OT; and John Fenoglio, AB6BH (also from San Diego) for this Zone 15 contest entry.

As many of you know, Dick Norton has been chipping away at entering CQ WW from each of the 40 CQ zones. Well, this was it: Dick has now become the first ham ever to operate in CQ WW from all 40 zones! And Phil Goetz is only 3 zones behind him. Art, Larry, Tony, and John all have a number of notches in their canes as well.

Local arrangements were handled flawlessly by Patrick, TK5EP, and Fabien, TK5MH. We basically took over a resort, normally closed for the season on the west coast of Corsica in the small town of Cargese. We operated 6 stations, 160 through 10 meters, each with a KW, and beams for 20, 15, and 10. Everything went very smoothly, and we ended up with over 11,000 QSOs and 15 Meg points.

This was not a stag party. Joan, N6KIM, accompanied K6ZH; as did the wives / friends of N6AA, W6XD, and K5OT.

Corsica is a simply gorgeous place - beautiful seacoast, high and rugged mountains, and relatively few people. We'll plan to do a presentation at an upcoming SDDXC meeting. 73 - Jim, K6ZH



CONTESTIATA

Go placidly amid the QRN and the QRM, and remember what peace there may be in S&P'ing. As far as possible, without surrendering your frequency, be on good terms with all stations. Speak/send your exchange clearly, and listen carefully to the response, even to the casual and non-contester types for they, too, have point value!. Avoid loud and aggressive stations, they are not worth the cost in rate to fight them. If you compare your Q-total mid-contest with others, you may become vain or bitter; for always there will be greater and lesser-reported Q-totals than yours. Enjoy your achievements as well as your plans. Keep interested in your own station, however humble; it is a real possession in helping the Club aggregate score. Exercise caution in playing with new software BEFORE the contest for untested software is full of trickery. But let not this blind you to what virtue there is in new software; many stations have used new software; and everywhere there are useful upgrades. Be yourself. Especially, do not feign pleasure over a new multiplier. Neither be cynical about propagation; for in the face of all plans; propagation is as predictable as the wind. Take kindly the counsel of the contest sponsors, gracefully surrendering to their requirements for log submittals. Nurture strength of spirit to shield you in sudden attacks of Murphy. But do not distress yourself with dark imaginings. Many fears are born of fatigue and loneliness of beingon a band and calling constant CQ's without answers. Beyond a wholesome discipline, be gentle with yourself. You are a contester and licensed operator; no less than the others who don't contest on the bands; you have a right to be there. And whether or not it is clear to you, no doubt the fortunes of contesting will change, as they should. Therefore be at peace with Murphy, whatever you conceive him to be. And whatever your labors and aspirations, in the QRM and confusion of the contest, keep an accurate and honest log. With all its QRM, QRN, and visits by Murphy, it is still fun. Be cheerful. Strive to be happy. Remember the cry 'WAIT TILL NEXT YEAR!!
