#### New police chiefs come to Capitol Heights

Officials with District Heights backgrounds cross one town over by Natalie McGill | Staff Writer



After a months-long search for leadership, the town of Capitol Heights has not only one but two people at the helm of its police department.

The Town Council officially swore in Jeff Dahn as police chief and Darrel Piper as deputy police chief at the March 8 council meeting and held a ceremonial swearing-in March 10 prior to a chiefs' meet-and-greet at the town municipal building.

The town has not had a police chief since former chief Robert Patton, who was sworn in June 2007, resigned in August to pursue other opportunities. The town held replacement interviews since September, Mayor Darrell Miller said. There now is one part-time and six full-time officers, including Dahn and Piper, said James Booth, town administrator

Miller said the town hired a deputy chief in addition to a chief to give the new chief additional support and add structure to the town's police

"I think you'll see things quickly improve in the town," Miller said.

Dahn, 40, of Rockville formerly served as police chief for the Edmonston and District Heights departments. Dahn left District Heights' department in July 2008 after 15 months to work as a government contractor in private security before accepting the Capitol Heights job.

"My heart has always been in policing," Dahn said. "I love community service. I understand the needs of the community because we were right next door in District Heights.'

#### Capitol Heights continues its search for new police chief

Six of town's officers support promoting deputy to the position

The search continues for a new Capitol Heights police chief, with town officials hoping to name a replacement by the end of February.

The seat has been vacant since former police chief Jeff Dahn was let go Oct. 25. Dahn, who was sworn in March 8, was out on medical leave for an indefinite amount of time since August and was unable to complete daily operations or assist the town reaching its goal of hiring additional officers, according to former town administrator James Booth.



- I SENT HIM A FOLLOW-UP E-MAIL THANKING HIM AND HIS STAFF FOR THEIR EFFORTS. TWO DAYS BEFORE THE EVENT, MY CONTACT INFORMATION WAS FORWARDED TO THE VOLUNTEER COORDINATOR FOR THE NPS BECAUSE THE COMMUNICATIONS SECTION HAD A NEED FOR TRAINED OPERATORS TO ASSIST I WAS CONTACTED BY E-MAIL. I RETURNED THE E-MAIL THAT SAME DAY, LISTING ALL OF MY QUALIFICATIONS AND EXPERIENCE.
- THE DAY BEFORE THE EVENT I MADE FINAL ARRANGEMENTS ON THE PHONE WITH THE COORDINATOR / FINAL VETTING PROCESS WAS COMPLETED.
- THURSDAY MORNING I ARRIVED, CHECKED IN AT THE NATIONAL PARK SERVICE HEADQUARTERS AND WAS IMMEDIATELY PUT TO WORK AT THEIR DISPATCH AND INCIDENT COMMAND POST.

- IN ADDITION TO THE OFFICIAL LIST OF SCHEDULED ACTIVITIES:
  - OVER 90 PERMITS ISSUED BY THE NATIONAL PARK SERVICE FOR EVENTS DURING THESE SAME DATES / AREAS
    - LARGEST OF WHICH WAS THE WOMEN'S MARCH ON WASHINGTON (MILLION WOMEN'S MARCH).
  - MASSIVE INFLUX OF PEOPLE CONVERGING INTO ONE SMALL AREA OF SPACE REPRESENTING LARGE CROSS-SECTION OF POLITICAL VIEWPOINTS, SOCIAL-ECONOMIC SITUATIONS, PHYSICAL CAPABILITIES AND MESSAGES THEY WISHED TO REPRESENT.
  - THE WASHINGTON METROPOLITAN AREA TRANSIT AUTHORITY REPORTED THEIR SECOND HIGHEST DAY OF RIDERSHIP EVER ON SATURDAY, JANUARY 21, 2017, DUE TO THE MASSIVE INFLUX OF PEOPLE IN THE AREA.
