In most cases, for the average "ham" operator, such as myself ... it equates to at least 3 or 4 coffee stops ... 2 gasoline stops ... perhaps 6 or 7 donut stops, and of course at least one nourishing meal at any of the numerous health food restaurants along the way ... such as "Billie's Burger Biggie" or "Taco-la-Racha-Gotcha" .. or my very favorite highway stop, which is at "Fred's Fried Fritter Filets". Fred is really doing a booming business, and has recently expanded into a national chain with over two locations.

By the time I got to the hotel .. I was famished, (Defined in Joe-Bob's Southern Collegiate Dictionary as .. I also had the chance to chat briefly with Keith .. (W5IU) ... who was representing AMSAT .. (The "ham" organization which focuses on "ham" satellite communications) Each time I see him at one of the conventions, I always try to make time to ragchew with him a bit. He is a wealth of knowledge, and is deeply involved in this facet of Amateur Radio. Keith has been active in "ham" satellites for many years, and goes to quite a few conventions in order to educate and demonstrate some of the basics on how to make radio contacts via the "ham" birds. Those of us who have been active in "working the birds" are saddened that in the past couple of years, two of our favorite satellites have been declared non-operational. AO-27 (Eyesat 1) and AO-51 (Amsat Echo) ... are now history. But, all is not lost. The SO-50 satellite (SaudiSat 1C) is still functioning ... and the new FOX-1 will be launched in the near future.

As I always do, I found lots of goodies, such as radios, antennas, tuners, meters, baluns and Loni Anderson posters. (younger folks probably have no idea who Loni is) Naturally I wanted to bring most of those treasures back to the shack .. but this year I exercised some restraint. (which is amazing, because I don't recall ever doing that before) So .. I limited my purchases to some RG8X coax .. a straight key for morse code transmissions, and an external speaker for the Icom 706mkIIG radio in my field operations "go-box". It was lots of fun ... and well worth the trip. Conventions and "hamfests" are just another way for us to "Ham It Up"... so when you get the chance, I urge you to saddle up and go to one soon.

Hamming it up

Amateur radio operators in SE Texas breathing fresh air into an old-school hobby

Amateur radio, also known as ham radio, has been a big part of Michael Frazier's life for as long as he can remember. Growing up in a family of amateur radio enthusiasts, Frazier was exposed to the hobby at a very young age and has fond memories of drifting off to sleep to the sound of his parents trying to make contact with other amateur radio operators.

"My original interest (in the hobby) was because both of my parents ... were active in ham radio," Frazier said. "My bedroom was my father's 'ham shack' — where all his radio equipment was. I spent many nights falling asleep to the sound of Morse code and radio frequencies."

Given his family's strong interest in amateur radio, it was more a matter of when, rather than if, Frazier would take up the hobby himself. At the age of eight, Frazier got his amateur radio license at his father's urging, becoming one of the youngest licensed ham radio



operators in the United States.
He's kept up with the hobby
ever since and enjoys the opportunity it provides to connect
with amateur radio enthusiasts

with amateur radio enthusiasts in other countries.

|"My most favorite thing of being involved in ham radio is the fascinating ability to make contact with other operators in foreign nations," Frazier said.

"The really big (contests encourage participants to) make contacts in foreign countries

or outside our 48 continental states. When you make contact over in Russia or Europe or Spain, it's kind of interesting

to know that radio can reach across the world."

Frazier and his parents are sharing their love of amateur radio with his 13-year-old son, Caleb, who recently earned his first FCC amateur radio operators license. Caleb, as part of the Big Thicket Amateur Radio Club, recently participated in the Field Day event, which tasks amateur radio operations with making contact with operators throughout the country during a mock emergency scenario.

Though many people consider ham radio to be an

old-fashioned hobby, Frazier said that amateur radio clubs in the county are experiencing an increase in youth involvement, thanks to youngsters like Caleb who have recently earned their license. At the Field Day event, Caleb was joined by 9-year-old Holly Wilson of Siblee, another recent amateur radio operator licensee.

"Of course, ham radio is generally considered an old man's hobby because the nature of it," Frazier said.

"With cell phones and things like that, people think, 'Why are you waiting on the radio?', but there are some who are still fascinated by the radio waves. I think there is a growing youth involvement."

From the ARRL & Others:

W1AW Centennial Operations Relocate on August 20 (UTC)

08/18/2014

The ARRL Centennial **W1AW** portable operations taking place throughout 2014 from each of the 50 states and now in Oklahoma will relocate at 0000 UTC on Wednesday, August 20 (the evening of August 19 in US time zones), to Ohio (W1AW/8) and North Dakota (W1AW/0). During 2014 W1AW will be on the air from every state (at least twice) and most US territories, and it will be easy to work all states solely by contacting W1AW portable operations. The **ARRL Centennial QSO Party** kicked off January 1 for a year-long operating event in which participants can accumulate points and win awards. The event is open to all, although only ARRL members and appointees, elected officials, HQ staff and W1AW are worth ARRL Centennial QSO Party **points**.

Working W1AW/x from each state is worth 5 points per mode/contact, even when working the same state during its second week of activity.

To earn the "Worked all States with W1AW Award," work W1AW operating portable from all 50 states. (Working W1AW or W100AW in Connecticut does *not*count for Connecticut, however. For award credit, participants must work W1AW/1 in Connecticut.) A W1AW WAS certificate and plaque will be available.

The ARRL has posted an ARRL Centennial QSO Party leader board that participants can use to determine how many points they have accumulated in the Centennial QSO Party and in the W1AW WAS operations. Log in using your Logbook of The World (LoTW) user name and password, and your position will appear at the top of the leader boards. Results are updated daily, based on contacts entered into LoTW.

TETRODE AND PENTODE TUBES

The Tetrode, or 4 element tube was invented in 1919 by Walter Schottky to combat the problem of stability and limited voltage gain of the Triode tube due to the Miller Effect.

An additional grid called the Screen Grid was added between the control grid and the Plate.

A Positive voltage, a little lower than the plate voltage was applied to it. The screen grid was also bypassed by a capacitor to ground for high frequencies.

This arrangement eliminated the Miller Effect by decoupling the control grid and the plate.

But this caused another problem called *Secondary Emission*. With the screen grid being positive the electrons emitted from the cathode would be accelerated and would strike the plate with enough force to dislodge electrons. These electrons would be attracted by the screen grid, reducing the plate current and amplification of the tube.

The solution for this problem was to add another grid between the screen grid and the plate. This grid was called the *Suppressor Grid*. The Suppressor grid was at the same potential as the cathode so it repelled the secondary electrons so the plate could collect them. (It was called the Suppressor Grid because it **suppressed** secondary emission). This tube was called the *Pentode* because it had 5 elements.

The Pentode was invented in 1928 by Bernard Tellegan. The pentode is generally favored over the Triode tube.


LB's Tips and Techniques.

Use upholstery cleaners on soiled seats. The same upholstery cleaners you use at home can be used on your car's upholstery. Use them sparingly, however, to avoid saturating the fabric. Use a clean cloth to wipe away the foam. On velour seats, brush the fibers gently to avoid matting them and to preserve the original texture of the fabric.
