# Ellie Van Winkle Memorial Scholarship

Announcement date: April 15th Applications due (on or before): June 15th

Boulder Amateur Radio Club (BARC) and Boulder Amateur Radio Club Junior (BARC JR) announce that they will award a scholarship of the amount shown in the announcement for this year and will accept applications between the above dates. A copy of this year's announcement showing the amount of this year's grant and other information may be obtained from the scholarship committee by writing to barc70@arrl.net. The formal name of the scholarship is the Ellie Van Winkle Memorial Scholarship. The deadline for receipt of completed applications is June 15th.

## **Eligibility Criteria**

- 1. Applicants must be full time, senior year high school students or college and university students who are 25 years of age or younger, as of the closing date of this scholarship announcement (June 15th). High school applicants must be graduating seniors who will be entering college or university in August or September of the upcoming academic year. Schools other than traditional colleges or universities will be considered if approved in advance by the scholarship committee. If the academic year of your educational institution begins in a different month, please also discuss this with the scholarship committee. The definition of full time student will follow the definition of the educational institution you will be attending. Current students must be planning to continue their studies in the upcoming academic year.
- 2. Applicants must be residents of Boulder County, Broomfield County <u>or</u> current members <u>or</u> former members of Boulder Amateur Radio Club Junior (BARC Junior). This means that if an applicant is not a resident of Boulder County or Broomfield County, but he or she is a current or former member of BARC Junior, then he/she is eligible to apply for this scholarship. If there is any question regarding eligibility, please discuss it with the scholarship committee.
- 3. Applicants must be currently licensed radio amateurs.

#### **Selection Criteria**

Applications will be considered by the scholarship committee using the following selection criteria:

- 1. Academics/Grade Point Average (20 points).

  What are the main courses you have taken and what is your grade point average?
- 2. Extra curricular activities or service involving school, community, church, or other organization (20 points).

What extra curricular or service activities have you participated in? What contributions

of service have you made?

3. Employment experience (20 points).

What employment experiences have you had and what have you learned from these experiences?

4. Amateur radio related activities (20 points).

Please describe your amateur radio related activities. What type of license do you hold and what type of operating have you done? What modes and bands have you utilized? Please mention any radio organizations you are in and the extent of your participation. If you have an amateur radio station in your home at the present time, please describe.

5. Future plans and special circumstances (20 points).

Please describe your future plans and touch on any special circumstances which may apply to your academic plans. Please include a brief mention of how you are generally funding your college or university education.

#### **Scholarship Committee**

A scholarship committee consisting of club members will consider all applications received. The committee will choose the winning candidate based on the selection criteria described above. The committee may, at its option, contact finalists to obtain additional information.
