Lawrence W. Banks, a former summer employee at Bridgeport and son of Sam Banks of the Electrical Department, recently completed his studies for the degree of Master of Science in Electrical Engineering at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, where he received a Bachelor of Science Degree in June 1967.

Larry was the first recipient from Bridgeport to receive a Carpenter National Merit Scholarship in 1963. Although he participated in the MIT Radio Society and in many intramural sports, most of his spare time was devoted to the MIT Musical Clubs. Larry spent five years as a member of the MIT Concert Band, for which he was first chair percussionist for the past three years. He has been a member and orchestra manager of the MIT Gilbert and Sullivan Society and of Tech Show, a student-written and produced "Broadway" musical.

A member of the Baton Society, the MIT Musical Honorary, he was one of the three seniors to receive an award "Presented for his Outstanding Contribution to Musical Life at MIT." Academically, Larry held a B-plus average as an undergraduate, and an A-minus average as a graduate and was elected an associated member of the MIT Chapter of the Society of the Sigma Xi, an organization "Devoted to the Promotion of Research in Science."
