
Club members were given the chance to introduce themselves and give their call signs. Minutes from last month's meeting were accepted as read.

The WB2CYN Repeater in Nassau County NY

The Wantagh Amateur Radio Club is now conducting a weekly 2-meter repeater net each Thursday evening at 8:00 PM, on the WB2CYN repeater in East Meadow, Nassau County NY. The machine, although not owned by this club, is an OPEN repeater owned by Steve WB2WAK who has graciously given permission to us to operate a weekly net and also use it for casual conversation and emergency traffic, if or when necessary.

This past Thursday, February 2<sup>nd</sup>, was our third net for the year, and shows great promise for member participation as the number of check-ins increase each week. Jon, KC2LWC, who is doing a great job as net control operator during the directed portions of the net, starts the net promptly at 8:00 PM.

Using an OPEN repeater gives us the opportunity to talk with non-member hams, who might be encouraged to join us at a regular monthly meeting at the Wantagh Library and eventually become club members. So, why not join us every Thursday evening for our weekly net, and also monitor the repeater frequency of 147.135 other times for casual conversations with club members and non-members alike.

Ham Radio University - About 4 of the club members present tonight attended HRU along with Sid K2LJH who presented a class at one of the sessions.

<u>Field Day</u> – consensus at board meeting Monday (all board members present, except Sid) was to present to the club the idea of having Field Day at the NARC site in Eisenhower Park, at the Senior Citizen Center.

It was decided to table the matter until the board members of both clubs are able to meet and discuss the specifics of Field Day operations.

<u>Health and Welfare:</u> Frank, N2RSO reported that Len KB2HK is doing well; however his wife had been in the hospital.

## New Business:

Frank N2RSO reports that the club now has access to a 2M open repeater in East Meadow. Frank printed up cards advertising the repeater, which is owned by Steve Schuck WB2WAK and is provided for our net use on a temporary trial basis.

The club net will occur on Thursdays at 8PM starting next Thursday. Jonathan, KC2LWC will serve as net control for the inaugural net.

Library Liaison - Chris KC2FBW, as a resident of the Wantagh library district, will serve as a liaison with the library. We will send a letter to the library to announce this. [Frank McKenna, library director]

Show and Tell - Jack KI2M presented his "fog hat", a baseball cap with a front mounted LED headlamp powered by AAA batteries.

50/50 - Elliot N2HYD won the 50/50, and the club took in \$7 in revenue as a result.

Dues: the club currently has about 24 members (of whom ten have already paid their dues). The expenses were discussed including insurance and Field Day gasoline. The club will investigate other alternatives, including a fundraiser of selling clothing articles with the club name on it. The board does propose that there should be a dues increase. It was proposed that the dues be increased to \$25; however we will table it until next month. All members were reminded that current dues are required to be submitted by the March meeting at the latest.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:42 PM.

# HERMAN AROND, N2CCF, BIDS FAREWELL TO NEW YORK

Herman Arond, N2CCF, a long-time member of the Wantagh Amateur Radio Club, bid farewell last week as he prepared to leave Long Island and take up residence at the Snug Harbor Home on Nelson Bay, North Carolina. He described his new hometo-be as a retirement community that preserves the resident's independence and individuality.

Captain Robert Richard Randall, a ship's master and Revolutionary War hero, founded the original organization, the Sailor's Snug Harbor in 1801. With guidance from his close associate, Alexander Hamilton, Randall arranged to bequeath his 21-acre estate, located in what is now the heart of Greenwich Village, to a perpetual trust. The purpose of the trust was to always provide a home for "aged, decrepit and worn out seamen". Built originally on Staten Island, New York, in 1833, the facility moved to Sea Level, North Carolina, in 1976. For the next 24 years, men and women who served on merchant vessels were cared for by the Trust.



Although far from decrepit and worn out, Herman, a retired Merchant Seaman and Ship's Radio Operator, has expressed a desire to leave behind the hustle and bustle stresses of New York and retire to a more relaxed and peaceful environment on the shores of North Carolina. At January's Wantagh Amateur Radio Club meeting, Herman, pictured above cutting a slice of his "goodbye" cake, said that he will try to erect a suitable antenna to allow him to continue his amateur radio hobby from his new home. He also stated that he'll try to return in June to continue his long-standing tradition of operating a CW station at Field Day. We look forward to learning his new email address after he gets situated, so we may continue to send him our monthly newsletters and other correspondence.
