

### **Local Happenings:**

Well, the Crucible Walk is over and it went very well for ICARC. In fact Doug Fitzsimmons, President of ICARC received a service plaque from the organizers on behalf of ICARC. We were able to use the Derry and Connelsville repeaters along with 440 cross-band repeating in most difficult areas as well as hf if one area to relay messages. We also use 146.55 simplex when appropriate. All in All it was a very good experience from which we learned very much about our capabilities. If we are invited next year we can do even more to help the organizers if given the opportunity. Just to give a brief synopsis of what was involved in the operation there were at least 11 ICARC members participating, 5 vehicles with 1 of these acting as a rover from site to site on each day. That left four vehicles each day to work at the service sites. Craig Bigler's and Dave Steiner's vehicles switched off as the roving vehicle for each day. Those were some long days for Dave, Craig, Joe, Doug, Ian, and Loredo! Look at the information below to see a summary of where folks were located on any given day. 



The board meeting started at about 7:00 pm. The usual stuff happened here.

The regular meeting was started by Doug Fitzsimmons at about 7:30 pm. The pledge of allegience was recited and a verbal roll call (call sign and first name) taken.

Terry provided the financial report and it was voted upon and accepted by the membership.

Dave Steiner reported on the net and indicated that about 12 hams checked in.

Doug reports that the Fall licensing class wil need to be longer than the usual 4 weeks, likely 6 weeks but has been postponed until Spring due to training at the 911 center.

Ernie attended the Leadership Conference and reports that it was about the same as last year.

The crucible walk this coming weekend was discussed. All assignments are known and no more prep is feasible.

The ICARC repeater committee reported that the PL tone paperwork is done. The county 2m repeater application for coordination has been submitted.

New business

Fred M. reports a change in the ACS procedures on the Western Area Net on Sunday morning (3990.5 Khz), there will be no early check-ins.

PA QSO party was discussed and it was to decided to operate individually and each operator submit a report under ICARC

It was brought up that an antenna workgroup is needed to checkout he antennas stored in repeater shack.

Craig brought up the fact that there is a Scouting event on Tuesday, September 27 in the evening and some volunteers may be needed.

Jamboree on the Air will be on the weekend of October 14, 15, 16 and any of our club participants will be needed on the 15<sup>th</sup>. There may be a need for volunteers for a setup day.

It was suggested that the board meet separately from the regular meeting possibly on another day. There was some resistance to this. Dave S. made a motion to have the board meet as they see fit. Seconded by Walter S. The motion was voted on and passed.

There was \$30.00 dollars donated. This meeting was adjourned at 8:30 PM
