

We operated 2A under W3BMD and obtained 271 contacts with two stations provided by Larry F. : ICOM 746 and Ten-Tec model 544 (vintage 1978). A 160 m loop put up by Fred Maize and Jerry Kiehl and Dave Dzelsky's multiband (80-10 m) end-fed antenna, both performed very well. We had a nice pot-luck dinner at 6:00 pm. Many thanks to those who brought the food and set it up. Chris Edwards-N3VFK operated for several hours on Saturday evening, and Bill McMillen logged for several hours. Others who operated and logged include, Dave Dzelsky, Jerry Kiehl, Doug Fitzsimmons, and Larry Freeman. Fred Maize was

instrumental in setting up one of the stations to get the 160 m loop tuned and working. The board meeting started at about 7:00 pm but no business was transacted.

The regular meeting was called to order by Doug Fitzsimmons at about 7:28 pm.

Roll call occurred.

Financial Report: Terry provided the financial report for May which was approved by vote of the members present.

Net update: Dave Steiner paid tribute to Roger Bartlebaugh-N3ULC with a formal sign-out as a silent key. The ICARC club members, unanimously, and wholeheartedly, supports this tribute presented by Dave in Roger's honor.

Old Business:

Doug pointed out that the repeater needs work. Feed-line, antenna, etc. need to be seriously discussed.

The airport event was discussed and plans made. Antennas: One g5rv and a 40 m end-fed will be setup. Cassius Fitzgerald will bring a rig and Larry Freeman will bring a rig. Dave Steiner, Doug Fitzsimmons, and Larry Freeman will meet on Friday at 3:00 pm at the repeater shack to pick up needed supplies and get to airport by 4:00 and meet with other crew members to setup antenna trailer, antennas, and the generator. Take down will be on Sunday as necessary.

Field day was discussed and plans made to operate 2A as we have had a lack of operators in the past. Fred Maize, Cass Fitzgerald, and Larry Freeman will go out to Blue Spruce park on Thursday at 4:30 PM and stake out the locations for the Antenna trailer, generator and the porta-potty. They will also explore the location for the loop antenna. There was some discussion about setting up two tents and Dave Dzelsky will set his own tent and antenna, that will be one station for W3BMD. Fred Maize will set up a 160 m or 80 m full wave loop, as seems plausible. Larry Freeman suggested having a g5rv for use if necessary. The setup crew will meet at Blue Spruce park Friday afternoon around 4:00 PM to set up every thing. A short crew will meet at the repeater shack at 3:00 pm on Friday to get needed supplies and meet others at Blue Spruce park. There will be a pot luck picnic at 6:00pm at the same pavilion as last year.

New Business: none discussed at this time.

There was \$29.00 dollars donated. This meeting was adjourned at about 8:34 PM
