# WINTER FIELD DAY



## WINTER FIELD DAY 2024 GETS RRC MEMBERS ENERGIZED

The skies were cloudy for the weekend, but the spirits were high inside the multi-op QTH of Steve NE3F as more than a dozen Reading Radio Club members contributed to a Winter Field Day operation that exceeded last year's turnout and score.

Nineteen RRC members took part in some capacity, including operating, logging or providing support to the event the last weekend of January.

The RRC team of operators logged 603 contacts for a net score of 59,290 points for Winter Field Day 2024.

That exceeded the 580 contacts and 2,900 points accomplished by 10 operators during a 7-hour period from the 2023 RRC multi-op effort from the Hawk Mountain Scout Reservation in Schuylkill County.

The most productive band in the 2024 event for the RRC was 40 meters where 396 contacts were recorded. The next most productive band was 10 meters where 126 contacts were made.

On 20 meters, 79 contacts made it into the log.

Nearly all of the contacts were on the phone bands, but Larry WR1B, logged two contacts on 20 meters CW.

The two-station operation logged 98 multipliers across the three bands with 40 meters producing the biggest multiplier total of 42. Multipliers represented the number of contacts which included U.S. states and Canada provinces

W3BN operated as 2-I, EPA, that's 2 Indoor stations operating from Eastern Pennsylvania.

The power output on both stations was limited to 100 watts, but with the wires and beams at Steve's contest operation, we were receiving outstanding signal reports up and down the frequencies.

The stations were on the air on Saturday, Jan. 27 from 2 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. and Sunday, Jan. 28 from about 8:45 a.m. to 2 p.m.

## SIMPLEX RADIO TEST STARTS OFF STRONG FOR 2024

A new year and a new session of the Reading Radio Club-sponsored Simplex Radio Test was held on Saturday, Jan. 13.

Ron K3RJW and Dave N3AMY served as net controls for the event setting up their operation on the parking lot of the medical imaging center at the top of Route 222 off Gring's Hill Road near the Mohnton exit.

The intrepid pair managed to pull in 21 check-ins for the session on 146.550 Megahertz Simplex and 14 check-ins for the 446 Megahertz Simplex session immediately following.

Ron reported that even with the height differential there were a couple of relays, ensuring everyone who called in got into the log.

The next Simplex Radio Test is scheduled for Saturday, Feb. 10 at 1 p.m. local time. We're looking at a high spot in western Berks.

Remember: The point of these monthly tests is to check your gear and your ability to check in with the net controls on a radio-to-radio contact – without use of repeaters.

The idea behind this is simple.

Our Berks ARES/RACES staff wants to get an idea of the number of ham radio operators who might be available and where in the county they are located in the event of an emergency in which one or both of the local amateur radio repeaters serving this area fail.

**PUT THIS DATE ON YOUR CALENDAR:** The next wide-area, multi-county Simplex Radio Test is tentatively scheduled for Saturday, May 11 at 1 p.m. local time.

We will be setting up at the William Penn Memorial Fire Tower along Skyline Drive, placing our antennas atop the fire tower's porch to pick up as many stations as possible in Berks and surrounding counties.

We're looking to hear from you! You don't have to be a regular check-in to the Simplex Radio Test. It's open to all licensed amateurs with a Technician or higher license class!
