It is one thing to say something to a friend, but there is no iron clad guarantee that they will not spread what you said. This is especially true of ham radio. It is not a private form of communication. You never know who is listening to your conversation. The military knew that and tried to encrypt their transmissions. Unfortunately, it has not always worked. The most successful disguised radio transmissions were in plain language during World War II. That was carried out by an elite group of bilingual Navajo who just used their normal conversations to relay messages. Some Amateurs try to mask what they say but we are not allowed to use encryption. Each amateur has a distinctive voice, and has to identify with their Callsign.

Violate any of the FCC rules and you just might get the dreaded letter notifying you to clean up your act or face fines.

This letter from the FCC marked "OPEN IMMEDIATELY" was received by one of our members recently. So, what did he do wrong? Seems like he was operating from the Mt Penn Fire Tower and was heard over several eastern Pa counties. The violation? OH! There was none!! Seems it was a Commendation for Best Practices and doing a good job!

- I will always send my full call sign.
- I will call and then listen for a reasonable interval. I will not call continuously.
- I will not transmit when the DX operator calls another call sign, not mine.
- I will not transmit when the DX operator queries a call sign not like mine.
- I will not transmit when the DX station requests geographic areas other than mine.
- When the DX operator calls me, I will not repeat my call sign unless I think he has copied it incorrectly.
- I will be thankful if and when I do make a contact.
- I will respect my fellow hams and conduct myself so as to earn their respect.

The next VE Test Session will be held on August 5, 2023 at 8:30 a.m. at our RRC Hamfest at Heritage Park in Sinking Spring, PA.





Travel on Park Ave. 0.3 miles to a dead end, then take a left onto Clematis St. Go 0.2 miles to the entrance of Heritage Park. Look for signs. The talk- in station will be W3BN, on the RRC repeater (146.91/.31-tone 131.8). Telephone is 610-781-5508.

For those using a GPS, the information is N 40 deg, 19.320 min., and W 76 deg, 1.950 min. The closest residence is 992 Clematis St., Sinking Spring, PA, 19608.

The hamfest opens at 7 a.m. for vendors and 8 a.m. for buyers. We usually conclude at noon. The cost is \$5 for hams over 18 years of age, and \$8 for sellers. Those taking VE exams, amateurs under 18, unlicensed spouses and children are admitted at no cost.

ARRL VE testing begins at 8:30 a.m. They will be administered inside the freight station. The cost is \$15 and a check should be made out to ARRL/VEC. Exact cash is also acceptable. One form of ID is required (or a copy of your license or CSCE certificate), and an email address and FRN number is needed. To eliminate any problems, call our RRC VE Coordinator, Harry Hoffman, W3VBY, at 610-678-8976 for information.

Mary Anne Nicholas, N3TVT, will be supervising food sales. As usual, hot breakfast and lunch items will be available at the RRC Café inside the freight station. Also, snack items, sodas, water and ice cream will be sold as well. At intervals, door prizes will be announced, so remember to keep your ticket stub and place the other half of the ticket in the blue coffee can in the freight station. Write your call sign legibly on the ticket in case you are not present for the drawings.

RRC blue T-shirts will be for sale and we may have a limited number of RRC baseball caps for sale as well.
