MOST PEOPLE WILL TAKE 222 BYPASS NORTH AND SOUTH AND GET OFF AT ROUTE 724 SHILLINGTON/SINKING SPRING EXIT. EITHER DIRECTION WHEN YOU EXIT AND GET TO 724 YOU WILL TURN RIGHT AND GO DOWN A HILL. (ON THE LEFT WILL BE A WEIS MARKET AND ON THE RIGHT WILL BE STORAGE BUILDINGS.) 
The Fox Hole

I am pleased that there has been an interest in transmitter hunting. Therefore the planning is in the works. Hopefully we will have information and maybe even a little instruction at the February General Meeting.

Recently there have been a few instances where operators have mistakenly transmitted unknowingly that the transmitter is on and also wrong type of emissions (I:E fldigi, aprs,) on the repeater. This is a good example of why tx hunting is so important. We need to get organized with ourselves to notify each other of a problem, get a triangulation pattern, and whoever can go to the area where that information leads and track down the problem.

I find transmitter hunting exciting and fun. It challenges me to track the tx and find it. Don't let the big term triangulation confuse you. It is actually simple. From where you are put your location in the center of a clock. If you know the direction of North that is 12:00. East is 3:00, South is 6:00, and West is 9:00. Now every minute is 6 degrees. 1:00 = 30 degrees. 2:00 = 60 degrees. So every hour is 30 degrees. I:E 7:00 would be 210 degrees. If you have an ht and you hold it horizontal and against your body when the signal goes down the tx is behind you. You don't need beams or yagi's just some ingenuity. Also if the signal is strong you can tune a little off frequency and repeat your direction finding.

Dave, N3AMY, and Ron, K3RJW, are two that will be happy to help out. Thanks and Happy hunting.

JAN SIMPLEX RADIO TEST POSTPONED BY THREATENING WEATHER AND CONCERNS ABOUT EXPOSING OPS TO ILLNESS

Plans for the Jan. 11 Reading Radio Club-sponsored Simplex Radio Test took an unexpected turn as team leadership took a look at the menacing weekend forecast and decided to scrap the test for the month.

The spread of flu and the nasty stomach bug – identified as the contagious norovirus – also played a big role in the decision to cancel the SRT because operators work in a confined space – the cabin of a Jeep or pick-up truck.

With hopes for better weather and better health for all, the Simplex Radio Test team is a “GO” for the return of the monthly test on Saturday, Feb. 15 at 1 p.m. local time.

New this year, we will be eliminating the 440 Megahertz side of the test and strictly focusing on check-ins on 2-meters – 146.550 Megahertz Simplex.

We also have a new net control operator joining the team for February and we’re confident you’ll recognize the voice.

The SRT group is also encouraging operators to try for contacts to earn the Reading Radio Club’s Pagoda Award. It’s easy to earn – 10 contacts with Reading Radio Club members. And, there’s usually a fairly good number of members checking in for the Simplex Radio Test.

You can learn more about the Pagoda Award at the Reading Radio Club’s website - <https://www.qsl.net/w3bn/>. Click on the Activities tab at the top and go to Pagoda Award.

The purpose of the Simplex Radio Test is to give you an opportunity to check out your 2-meter set-up be it a base, mobile station or HT.

The team is trying to identify good locations for net controls to use to pick up operators for emergency service in the event one or both of the Reading repeaters fail.

It’s also fun to see if you can hear and work the net control station and they can hear you. The use of relays from operators is also helpful to identify weak stations.

This month’s test will be at a location south and west of Reading from a reasonably elevated spot. Hope to hear you on the air for the February SRT on 146.550 Megahertz Simplex!!!


