#### IF AT FIRST YOU DON'T SUCCEED....SRT TEAM EYES MARCH TEST By Mark Abramowicz NT3V

The Reading Radio Club-sponsored Simplex Radio Test was scrubbed for a second straight month due to our winter weather.

The SRT team decided to cancel the Feb. 15 test after the snow forecast looked pretty threatening the night before. They wisely decided to call off the test. Snow flakes began falling throughout most of the area hours before the test was to begin.

The team decided it was best not to jeopardize the safety of the net controls traveling to the planned location to take part.

The team now plans to conduct the March Simplex Radio Test on Saturday, March 15 at 1 p.m. local time.

It's hoped that the weather will begin to moderate and the flu and other illnesses will have abated by mid-March.

If you missed last month's SRT bulletin announcement, the team has decided to discontinue the 70 cm side of the test so there will be no move to 446 Megahertz Simplex. The test will focus solely on 2 meters -146.550 Megahertz Simplex.

There will be a new net control joining the team for the March test. We've been promoting it the past two months. I'm sure you'll be pleased to hear who it is.

The Simplex Radio Test is open to all licensed amateurs in Berks and surrounding counties. You don't have to be a member of the Reading Radio Club to take part.

However, you will have an opportunity to make contacts with net check-ins who are Reading Radio Club members to work toward earning the club's Pagoda Award.

It only takes 10 contacts with Reading Radio Club members to earn the award.

Talk it up at the RRC meeting on Friday, March 14 – the night before the Simplex Radio Test and encourage members to get on the air for the test AND to help you earn the award. It's a nice piece of "wallpaper" worth framing and hanging in your radio shack.

You can learn more about the Pagoda Award at the Reading Radio Club's website - http://www.w3bn.org. Click on the Activities tab at the top and go to Pagoda Award.

A lot of you check in weekly to the nets conducted on the two repeaters serving the Reading area. Here's an opportunity to check your 2-meter station – base, mobile or HT – on a simplex frequency, 146.550 Megahertz.

It's all part of our responsibilities as licensed amateur radio operators to be prepared to serve the community's communications needs in the event of an emergency – especially if one or both of the Reading repeaters go down.

The net control team is working to identify good locations for portable simplex radio operations. That's why the team moves to different locations each month.

It's also important to see if you can hear and work the net control station and that they can hear you. Relays from operators also helps the net controls identify weak stations.

Hope to hear you on the air for the March 15 SRT on 146.550 Megahertz Simplex!!!




