# Presentations

**January** – Since discussed and decided that future presentations would happen prior to the meeting, this month was the last time we had a presentation following the business aspects. Jeff Martin (AA3JM) gave a presentation of the TinySA hardware, using a signal generator and a few HTs to demonstrate how to use this hardware to look for spurious emissions, along with a review of how signal strength is measured and shown in decibels (dB).

**February** – In 2024, Lucy (AB3MY) visited both the Philippines and Brazil and did some work to activate some POTA Parks and SOTA Summits. She gave a slide show of the places she visited and help she received to get on the air. Darren (KC0NAH) had visited Israel in April/May 2023 and operated 4 of the tallest Summits in Northern Israel which also coincided with a few Parks on the Air entries. He presented some "how-to" of getting set up to go, the gear used, and some pictures of friends made along with places visited. Following these two presentations, Allan gave a quick review of a bear breaking down his fence, but most importantly, the work done to help get a better VHF/UHF antenna in the air for Fred (N1OEP).

**March** – James (WE3D), Jim (KC3GBS) and Darren (KC0NAH) shared visual examples of digital interface devices to go between computers and various transceivers. Some of these were homebrewed, and some off-the-shelf, like digirig or SignaLink. Others shared anecdotes of some problems but also the many ways that these interfaces have opened up computer use in the hobby. Also noted several of the newer rigs (notably Icom) that have built-in sound card and rig-control hardware making it super easy to use. There were also some demonstrations of portable antennas that James (WE3D) has built and uses with his portable, go-bag kit for things like POTA.

The club operated during Winter Field Day (Jan 25 - 26) as W3VPJ from Ridge Runners Rod and Gun Club, near Wellsboro, PA. Our club climbed to the top of our class/category world-wide (2-transceiver-indoor) with 1467 SSB/CW/ JS8Call / Winlink QSOs, and a final score of 49,878! James (WE3D), Jim (KC3GBS), Pat (W3RGA), John (K3MD), Darren (KC0NAH), and Gene (KC3SHC) contributed to the high score for the club! We operated with a 160m full wave "sky loop" for SSB, and a 10m, 20m, 40m, 80m inverted-V fan dipole for Data/CW.
