# New hams: Want to work some DX?

If you'd like to work some easy DX, two great opportunities are coming up. The CQ World Wide DX SSB Contest is on October 25-26 and the CW contest is on November 29-30. These are probably the two largest DX contests of the year, with thousands of participants trying to work as many people as possible - they need you as much or more than you want them. There is very little split frequency operation except on 40m SSB.

There are many big contest stations with big equipment and big antennas - they can hear your 100 watts if you are relatively in the clear. The "trick" is propagation and time. The first contest night (Friday) is really tough for small stations on 20m and down - lots of pileups of 1500 watt stations. You do not have to enter the contest to make a contact, but you will need to send the correct contest exchange - for us, "59 zero5" or "595" on ssb and "5nn 5" on cw (we are in CQ Zone 5).

If you want to use logging software or especially if you want to enter the contest, Google "N1MM" and look at his contest logging software. It is one of the best and the price is right (free). If your rig is connected to a computer, it has a number of really neat features. Read the manual (at least for the parts you intend to use), and check about a week before the contest for any updates. It is easy to export your log in the Cabrillo format required for entering logs in the contest. You also should read the contest rules in CQ or on their website.

Most of all, have some fun! If the propagation gods are with us, it can be great fun. - *Gerry*, *K4IDD*



### FCC Enforcement Bureau Warns Two Hams for Failing to Identify Properly



The FCC Enforcement Bureau has released Warning Notice letters it sent in July to two radio amateur, advising them that it monitored transmissions in which they failed to identify properly. The Bureau posted the correspondence earlier this month on its Amateur Radio Service Enforcement Actions web page. The two notices from FCC Enforcement Bureau Special Counsel Laura L. Smith, both dated July 21, contain essentially the same language.

## No Easy Answers for RadioShack's Slow, Downward Slide

Back in the day, Radio Shack employees would answer the phone by saying, "You've got questions, we've got answers." But Radio Shack now seems stumped, and the "B" word is looming ever larger as the retailer — once a go-to shop for electronic components and, at one point, even Amateur Radio and shortwave receivers — casts about for a white knight. Last March, in the wake of a substantial drop in holiday sales and a big fourthquarter loss, the Fort Worth, Texas-based Radio Shack announced plans to close 1100 of its outlets, leaving the chain with 4000 stores, including more than 900 dealer franchises. The last quarter was more of the same.

The new Amateur Service vanity call sign regulatory fee of \$21.40 became effective on September 11. The FCC released a Report and Order and Further Notice of Proposed Rulemaking (R&O) on August 29, in which it recalculated the fee to \$21.40 for the 10-year license term. The \$5.30 increase




