It was a dark and stormy night....Well, actually it was morning, and it was a dark and really, really bad looking cloud that was moving quickly towards us from the north.Since I had just washed my "Communications and Command" vehicle...(My little Tacoma truck)...I was not very happy about the possibility of it being zapped by lightening, or perhaps getting mud on it. I was also slightly concerned about the marathon runners, but hey.....that's a minor issue.

Anyway....as it turned out....when the fierce looking cloud finally hit our location...the wind howled at nearly 6 miles per hour...and as I sought shelter in my truck, the intensity of the rain was such that I had to turn on the windshield wipers at least 4 times to see the runners as they went by. Some people don't realize how much money "hams" spend on equipment, often purchased specifically to be used in helping out during these events....or during any kind of emergency that might affect the area. So....it's not only our time that we donate....it's much more. And, it's because we want to. It is our public service to the community.... and thanks go out to all of you.

From ARRL:

ARRL in Action: What Have We Been Up to Lately?

This feature -- including convenient Web links to useful information -- is a concise monthly update of some of the things ARRL is doing on behalf of its members. This installment covers the month of October.

As <u>Hurricane Sandy</u> pounded the East Coast, the Emergency Response Team at ARRL Headquarters supported the affected Sections.

The ARRL held its 2012 National Convention at Pacificon in Santa Clara, California on Friday, Saturday and Sunday, October 12-14.

Acting on various *Petitions for Rulemaking*, the <u>FCC issued a *Notice of Proposed Rulemaking*</u> that seeks to change the Amateur Radio licensing rules, especially as they concern former licensees. It also looks to amend the Amateur Service rules to allow amateur stations to transmit additional emission types in order to permit Time Division Multiple Access (TDMA) in the Amateur Service.

Cub Scouts from Den 8 of Pack 15 in Middlebury Connecticut participated in the 55th annual Jamboree on the Air from W1AW, the Hiram Percy Maxim Memorial Station.

ARRL International Affairs Vice President Jay Bellows, K0QB, and IARU Secretary Rod Stafford, W6ROD, <u>attended</u> the meeting of the IARU Region 2 Executive Committee.

The ARRL released five new books: the hardcover and softcover editions of *The ARRL Handboof for Radio Communications* (90th edition), *The ARRL Operating Manual (10th edition)*, *The Amateur Radio Public Service Handbook*, *The Care and Feeding of Transmission Lines* by *QST* Technical Editor Joel Hallas, W1ZR, and *Antenna Modeling for Beginners* by H. Ward Silver, N0AX. The 2013 ARRL Calendar, featuring historic highlights from the pages of *QST*, was also released.

The ARRL held its Seventh Annual ARRL On-Line Auction.

W1AW received its semi-annual antenna inspection and got a new 160 meter dipole.

For the 28th consecutive year, the ARRL hosted the United States Telecommunications Training Institute's Amateur Radio Administration Course.

The ARRL invites nominations for the 2012 ARRL International Humanitarian Award.

After more than eight years of professional service to the League, ARRL Media and Public Relations Manager Allen Pitts, W1AGP, retired.

The ARRL's <u>Maxim Society</u> -- comprised of radio amateurs who have made financial commitments to the ARRL exceeding \$10,000 in lifetime contributions -- now has 113 members.

The ARRL presented MFJ's Martin F. Jue, K5FLU with the ARRL Special Achievement Award.

DXCC News: The DXCC Desk approved the 2010 J5IFD DXpedition to Guinea-Bissau for DXCC credit.

The winner of the October QST Cover Plaque award is James Klitzing, W6PQL, for his article "Solid State 1 kW Linear Amplifier for 2 Meters."

The December print issue of <u>OST</u> was released to the printer and the digital edition was released to the digital publisher. The November digital edition of <u>OST</u> was <u>made available to ARRL members</u>.

Official Observer Desk: ARRL Field and Regulatory Correspondent Chuck Skolaut, K0BOG, handled complaints concerning CW identification, antenna restrictions, operating overseas, making distress calls, spurious signals on 160 meters, unidentified signals on 29.000 MHz.

Member Contact: ARRL RFI Engineer Mike Gruber, W1MG, attended NearFEST in Deerfield, New Hampshire; ARRL Field Regulatory Correspondent Chuck Skolaut, K0BOG, attended the Florida State Convention in Melbourne, Florida; ARRL Lab Manager Ed Hare, W1RFI, attended the ANSI EMC Committee Meeting in Santa Clara, California, the IEEE EMC Society Chapter Meeting in Detroit, Michigan and the IEE EMC Society Standards Development Committee Meeting in Denver, Colorado; ARRL Chief Operating Officer Harold Kramer, WJ1B, attended MFJ's 40th Anniversary Celebration in Starkville, Mississippi; ARRL Chief Executive Officer David Sumner, K1ZZ, attended the IARU Administrative Council Meeting and Region 3 Conference in Ho Chi Minh City, Vietnam.

QST On-The-Go

The Balloon Group had a very successful launch on, August 4, 2012. The W5RIN-8 Balloon departed the Beaumont Municipal Airport after the National Weather Service made their positive prediction for launch. W5RIN-8 lifted off at 09:53am CDT. The balloon reached a maximum altitude of 93,772 ft at 11:27am and burst a few seconds later starting it's descent. The TV camera performed great sending many GBs of video. Approximately 20 radio operators participated in the flight in some way or another. The W5RIN-8 Balloon descended gently into a 67,000 acre hunting lease in Plum Grove, Liberty County, Texas and landed at 12:12pm CDT.

They managed to shoot enough tree limbs to allow it to fall to the ground and recovered the payload. Richard, KA5IQX, made the trek to take the payload into custody and turn it over to Rich, N5ALE, who has it ready to go again already. Thanks to All that helped out and especially to Mr Wells and Mr Chapman for their Bravery and Perseverance in taking good care of our package. Also thanks goes out to Liberty County SO, EMS & Tarkington Fire Department.



LB's Tips and Techniques.

The cooling system should be completely flushed and refilled about every 24 months. The level, condition, and concentration of coolant should be checked. (A 50/50 mix of anti-freeze and water is usually recommended.) Never remove the radiator cap until the engine has thoroughly cooled. The tightness and condition of drive belts, clamps and hoses should be checked by a pro.
