## Field Day Digital Modes (PSK31) Peter Hoffman, W6DEI

Even if you're not a contester, the enthusiasm of Chris Tate's presentation at the March meeting had to rub off on you. Field Day is a great way to get a taste of contesting and there's still time to get up to speed.

Preparing to operate on Field Day means, first and foremost, getting in some air time *before* the contest. Operating SSB is the easiest place to start - we all can talk. CW obviously takes a little more practice. Digital falls somewhere in between. Since I'll be the captain of the digital station this year, I'd like to offer my assistance to anyone who wants some help on digital contesting. Even if you don't plan to operate on Field Day, I'd be happy to help you get your station set up for digital modes at home. PSK31 is a great mode for casual rag-chewing too.

So, if you're not already operating digital modes, what do you need? The basic requirements (besides the radio station) are a modest computer, free software, and an inexpensive PC-to-rig interface. The dozens of digital modes included in the basic software, from RTTY to JT65, offer amazing capabilities for DX, weak signal work, and emergency communications. Also, new modes keep popping up every year, only requiring a guick software update. As for contesting, I've found digital modes to be by far the most relaxing to operate. Your voice won't give out on you, and your ears won't take a beating from the signals and noise in your headphones. The soundcard and software do 90% of the work. In the quiet of the digital mode Field Day tent, with a couple of mouse clicks you've worked and logged a contact. So please let me know if you're interested.
