Section Emergency Coordinator John Rabold, KS6M, will present ARES in the East Bay Section. The Amateur Radio Emergency Service is an ARRL program for licensed hams who wish to serve when disaster strikes. John will describe how ARES is being reborn as a vital program in the East Bay Section, including how it is organized, who it supports, how it relates to other ham radio emergency communications (emcomm) programs, and how an emergency response might play out. Suggestions will be included for preparing to deliver the best possible service as a registered ARES member.

General Meeting Minutes March 9, 2012 Mike McMillan, K6MCM, Secretary

Opening: The meeting was called to order at 7:34 p.m. by President Fowler. Sign-in sheet was circulated, 19 members and guests signed in. A round of self-introductions was made. Minutes of the February 10, 2012 meeting were approved as published in *The Blown Fuse*.

President Fowler asked those present, "What have you done with Amateur Radio in the past month?" Responses included participated in nets, created a repair list, gave some equipment to a new ham, DX with ships at sea, ARRL DX contest (contacted 34 stations), prepared for Field Day, read QST, built a kit, attended the NorCal QRP meeting, and built an antenna launcher.

Program: First Vice-President Burris reported that he was presenting tonight's program "Confessions of a WSJT Junkie". Next month's program is scheduled to be by John Rabold, KS6M, on the status of the ARES program in Contra Costa County.

Hospitality: Refreshments were set up by Stanton Gleason.

Membership: Third Vice-President Primbsch was not present.

Finance: Treasurer Jenkins reported club financial information. General fund balance was \$3,927.92; station fund balance was \$4,187.13. Monthly income was \$92.75; expenses were \$726.03.

Secretary: Secretary McMillan reported no correspondence of significance received.

Station Manager: Gleason reported a station roof work-party was scheduled for March 18, starting at 9:30 am. More helpers are needed.

Public Events/Education: Grizzly Peak Bike Ride is coming May 6, more volunteers needed at fixed or mobile sites. See Randy for information about Marin County events. The 75th anniversary of the Golden Gate Bridge will have a special event station, W6G; they are looking for operators. Boy Scout Fages Trail Hike June 2 needs volunteers. The USS Hornet is having a special event station in April in honor of the 70th anniversary of the Doolittle raid on Japan. Boy Scouts Jamboree On-The-Air will be at Camp Herms in October; this will be coordinated with a radio merit badge class in September.

Web Page: Webmaster Hoffman reported website is current. Information on tonight's program will be posted soon.

President: Fowler reported club is running well. Board is trying to add value for the members.

New Members and Guests: none acknowledged.

Next Meeting: the next meeting will be on April 13, 2012.

Closing: There being no further business, the membership meeting was adjourned at 8:10 p.m.

Program: After a break for refreshments, Jack Burris, K6JEB, gave a presentation on weak signal computer software WSJT (Weak Signal, Joe Taylor, K1JT). These are open-source programs designed for weak-signal digital communication by amateur radio. Normal usage requires a standard SSB transceiver and a personal computer with soundcard. WSJT offers specific digital protocols optimized for meteor scatter, ionospheric scatter, and EME (moonbounce) at VHF/UHF, as well as HF skywave propagation. The program can decode fraction-of-a-second signals reflected from ionized meteor trails and steady signals 10 dB below the audible threshold. WSPR (Weak Signal Propagation Reporter) is a program designed for sending and receiving low-power transmissions to test propagation paths on the MF and HF bands. Users with internet access can watch results in real time on-line. MAP65 is a wideband, polarizationmatching receiver for JT65 signals. Its principal application is EME on the VHF and UHF bands.

Field Day is always the fourth full weekend of June, beginning at 1800 UTC Saturday and running through 2059 UTC Sunday. Field Day 2012 will be held June 23-24, 2012.
