

General Meeting Minutes July 13, 2012 Mike McMillan, K6MCM, Secretary

Opening: The meeting was called to order at 7:34 p.m. by President Fowler. Sign-in sheet was circulated, 20 members and guests signed in. A round of self-introductions was made. Minutes of the June 8, 2012 meeting were approved as published in *The Blown Fuse*.

Program: First Vice-President Burris reported that tonight's program would be by Ron Bunch, W4FEK, on CERT and RACES in Contra Costa. Next month's program is scheduled to be on Radio Sausalito, a small independent radio station.

Hospitality: Second Vice-President Sparks provided an excellent array of refreshments.

Membership: Third Vice-President Primbsch was absent.

Finance: Treasurer Jenkins reported club financial information. General fund balance was \$3,527.22; station fund balance was \$3,664.25. Monthly income was \$49.94; expenses were \$490.46 including a \$350 deposit for the Field Day site, which should be refunded.

Secretary: Secretary McMillan reported correspondence included renewals, QSL card requests, an Official Observer card, and a *Blown Fuse* address correction.

Station Manager: Gleason was absent.

Public Events/Education: Jenkins reported some events were coming in August. See Randy for details.

Web Page: Webmaster Hoffman reported all is well with website. Some Field Day photos will be on the site soon.

President: Fowler reported a great time was had during Field Day – thanks to all who helped make it a success. Some food and fuel costs were incurred, donations are welcome. EBARC name badge orders are being taken. There are interesting solar conditions lately, including a recent solar flare.

New Members and Guests: new member Thyme, KJ6PVU; and guest Larry, KJ6WTL, were acknowledged.

Announcements: 4Cs/EBARC annual picnic is coming the second Sunday in September. Due to the difficulty of getting volunteer labor to help repair the club station roof, At-Large member Wikander offered three proposals for the club station: 1) get rid of the station, 2) hire a roofing contractor and assess the costs among members, or 3) buy a foreclosed property and convert it into a new club station location. President Fowler then reviewed club station history and current status. Fowler asked if anyone had ideas to increase the value of the club to members, please share them with any EBARC board member.

Next Meeting: the next meeting will be on August 10, 2012.

Closing: There being no further business, the membership meeting was adjourned.

Presentation: After a break for refreshments, Ron Bunch, W4FEK, gave a presentation on

RACES and its activities in Contra Costa. They are sponsored by the Sheriff's Department. Their mission is "to train, organize, and deploy radio amateurs in support of Contra Costa County agencies and organizations." The group meets monthly in the county emergency operations center (EOC) in Martinez on the fourth Wednesday of the month. They have a monthly training or exercise on the third Saturday of the month. Some Useful Ham Radio Links Robin Spalding, N6RLS

There are so many sources of useful info on the web - with more sites appearing every day. Trying to do a comprehensive list would more than fill a whole issue of *The Blown Fuse*. There are spotting sites, any number of DIY sites, and pages for every known facet of Amateur Radio. Here are just a few that I've found useful, starting with the big ones; QRZ.COM, A6CV.COM, ARRL.ORG, DXZONE.COM, and EHAM.NET - sites any ham will probably already know. Each has links to tons of ham-related info. There are more coming around every day. Start searching!

A useful site for vintage ham info turns out to be the Internet Archive - http://archive.org/ - a goldmine for vintage material of all kinds. The entire run of 73 Magazine is available here: http://archive.org/details/73-magazine.

Obviously some material is too dated for much use today, but many things - antenna construction articles for example - are still quite useful and are still referenced today by folks writing new articles. If you do a search on the Internet Archive site, be sure to select the "media type" to narrow things down - "Audio" or "Moving Images" or "Texts" will bring up subsets of things found in an "All Media Types" search.

Speaking of "vintage" stuff, the ARRL site has excellent references to all their past articles (back to 1915) and product reviews. They are searchable by date or product name/number, and easily printable. (Members only!)

Also, for out-of-date or not-found ("404") pages, especially on Amateur Radio topics: try the Wayback Machine on those "dead" links: http://archive.org/web/web.php.
