Randy announced the Marin Amateur Radio Society's auction of surplus club equipment to be held tomorrow, 7/11.

The monthly Sunday 4Cs breakfast at Denny's was mentioned.

Randy announced that the Grizzly Peak Cyclists gave EBARC a \$500 gift in appreciation of our support for the 2015 Grizzly Peak Century on May 3rd. He suggested we share the money equally with the two clubs whose repeaters made our support possible. The membership approved the measure to split the \$500 award three ways between EBARC, the Contra Costa Repeater Association, WA6HAM, and the Cathay Amateur Radio Club, W6BUR.

Ken Fowler, KO6NO, gave us a debriefing on Field Day this year at Cesar Chavez Park in Berkeley. After missing Field Day the last two years, it was good to be back again. Thanks go to all who helped with moving the equipment, the setup and teardown, and for the great flyer and publicity. Due to the consolidation of club equipment into storage following the loss of our clubhouse, much of the gear had already been culled and sorted. We operated as class 2A, and had a GOTA station also. We made a good amount of contacts this year, not the most we've had, but we did pretty well. There were some antenna glitches, but overall things held up well. We should have kept a visitor's log. Ken sent a letter to the mayor of Berkeley regarding the event.

Ken added that he wants to work with those who want to learn to run the club and Field Day. He does not plan to be the mastermind of next year's Field Day.

We discussed the possibility of giving classes to forty or so El Cerrito Fire Department employees.

Also noted is that July 10th is Nikola Tesla's birthday. Happy Birthday, Nikola!

The business portion of the meeting was adjourned for tonight's presentation by Clayton Nall, NF1R. He spoke about Summits on the Air (SOTA) and his mountaintop travails and conquests. He also brought along a good part of his SOTA gear, including a KX3 transceiver and AlexLoop Walkham portable antenna. He gave us a demonstration of the software he uses.
