

The meeting at the EI Sobrante Library multipurpose room was called to order at 7:58 p.m. by President Ken Fowler, KO6NO. Ken reported that this meeting place can probably become a regular one for us. As we continue to use it, the library will consider us "regulars." There is no fee. He also reported challenges for next year, including the possible need to close or move the club station.

John Wood, N6JDW, made a motion that the minutes from the November general meeting, as printed in *The Blown Fuse*, be accepted as printed. The motion was seconded by Jack Burris, K6JEB, and passed unanimously.

1st VP and Program Chair Texx, KG6ATH, just returned from a 6-week job in Calexico. He hasn't planned January's program.

3rd VP and Membership Chair Sharon, AA6XZ, reminded members to renew and tell her of any roster changes. Members are encouraged to carefully read the Blown Fuse for the meeting place for the upcoming month.

Treasurer Gordy, NU6W, read the November Treasurer's Report. It includes reimbursement for our stolen generators. The report will be printed in the January "Blown Fuse".
