New General License Class! Ken Fowler, KO6NO

The East Bay Amateur Radio Club will offer a class to prepare applicants for the General Class Amateur Radio License, starting January 18, 2019 and ending April 5, 2019. The class will meet on ten of these twelve Fridays from 6:30 p.m.to 9:00 p.m. at the United Methodist Church, on Argyle Rd. off Appian Way in El Sobrante. The Textbook is, *ARRL General*

Class License Manual for Ham Radio 8th Edition. Books will be available for purchase at the class.

This class is intended for hams with a Technician class license and will cover electrical principles, amateur radio equipment, and communication modes. Topics common to the Technician class license such as FCC rules and safety will be covered only as necessary.

FCC examinations and license applications will be administered at the final class session by EBARC Volunteer Examiners for a fee of \$15.

Opening: The Friday, 14 December, 2018 general EBARC meeting in the El Sobrante United Methodist Church meeting room started about 7:30 p.m.

Opening: Following the presentation by Jack Burris, outgoing president Jay Sparks, KJ6HSH, announced the new and returning Club officers. The votes had been tallied by Mathison Ott, Jay Sparks, and Peter Hoffman during the Executive Committee meeting earlier in the evening. Sharon Primbsch and

myself (Robin Spalding) retained their offices as 3rd Vice President and Secretary, respectively. The 2019 officers were then installed.

Jay then introduced incoming President Ken Fowler, KO6NO. Ken reflected on his years as president (2008-2014) and said that after keeping the club going, it's time to get it growing. We need more members participating in Club activities, including members who don't come to meetings.

Ken looks forward to returning to the former Library meeting location, hopefully in 2019. He wants to have Executive Committee meetings on a day and place away from the General meetings again, if possible.
