

July 8th EBARC Meeting Jack Burris, K6JEB, Program Chair

We'll meet in the community meeting room at the El Sobrante Library, 4191 Appian Way. Enter through the back door.

For our July meeting, Rich Holoch, KY6R, will talk to us about logging and QSLing. Rich spoke at EBARC earlier this year about DX antennas.

Rich says, "The work expression, 'The job isn't finished until the paperwork is done.' is very similar to an old ham expression, 'The final courtesy of a QSO is a QSL card.' Even though postage is a lot more than it was back in 1973, when my Novice ticket arrived in my mailbox on my 13th birthday, I still love receiving QSL cards in the mail. I run to the mailbox like I was still a kid. I pretty much work only DX these days, and to defray postage costs, you now have the option to QSL electronically and for free (so long as you keep a logbook). It has never been easier to QSL.

I will present part of my collection of very rare DX QSL cards, and also share some of the old vintage cards from the past. I'll also cover the

ARRL's LOTW and eQSL, and compare and contrast cards with electronic QSL's and why and when you might use one method over the other. I'll share some funny stories about the QSL cards and how they remind me of some 'interesting' ways that I worked the stations whose call signs appear on the QSL."
