Program, Texx, KG6ATH: Things have shifted around somewhat due to changes in the availability of speakers and possibly due to the shifting from second Friday to first Friday meetings for the next two months. The Salvation Army needs the meeting room on the second Fridays of the next two months, so we

Revisions to Bylaws, Sharon, AA6XZ: Proposed revisions to bylaws of the club will be on the website.
