

QRM de KO6NO Ken Fowler, EBARC President

We are definitely at the beginning of another solar cycle. In recent weeks we have seen an upswing in the Solar Flux Index and Sunspot Numbers to numbers not seen for five years. This last week, many major solar flares have been spotted, producing some radio blackouts, but also causing the opening of the high bands for DX and ragchewing contacts. Although there are indications that solar cycle 24 will have a peak sunspot number much lower than previous cycles, it appears that we will have several years of good to normal activity on HF.

It's time to think about the ARRL Field Day coming on June 25. EBARC is once again planning to take to the field at Caesar Chavez Park at the Berkeley shoreline. For many years, Field Day has been a major event for EBARC and the club has acquired a superb collection of equipment. There are few sites in the East Bay with better facilities for setting up a Field Day station than Caesar Chavez Park. EBARC has many operators with years of experience in handling the crush of Field Day setup, logistics, and operating issues.

Field Day is about more than equipment, rules, propagation, and sites. Field Day is for people, and especially for people who enjoy spending long hours overcoming the problems. Of course, the club would like to run up a high score by making lots of contacts. To do that, we need dedicated operators who are willing to make and log contacts at the highest rate possible. But there are many other ways, under the ARRL Field Day Rules, for increasing our score. We can make points even before Field Day starts by obtaining publicity with a press release and by inviting public officials to our site. During Field Day we can achieve more points by originating messages into the National Traffic System, by having a technology display, and by operating a Get On The Air Station.

I am glad to announce that Jack, K6JEB, has agreed to act as EBARC Field Day Coordinator this year. Jack will need help from all of us. Please think about how you can help and volunteer. Don't worry about whether you are doing it right. Remember what I learned in Cub Scouts: If you aren't having fun, you aren't doing it right!

The meeting at the El Sobrante Public Library Meeting Room was called to order at 19:34 hours by President Ken Fowler. There was a sign-in sheet available. 19 members and guests signed in. (22 were counted.) A round of introductions was the first order of business.

The minutes of the January 14, 2011 meeting were approved as published in *The Blown Fuse*. First Vice President Burris reported that tonight's presentation would be by Steve Bjork, KI6JJW on APRS. He also reported that the March program would be by Chris Tate, N6WM, on contesting.

Second Vice President Sparks was absent. Stanton Gleason had refreshments available.

Third Vice President Primbsch reported that she had sent out renewal reminders. The roster will be put together in mid-February.

Treasurer Wood reported that January finished with \$3,805.95 in the general fund, and \$4,297.00 in the station fund. There was

\$172.00 in income and \$417.85 in disbursements from the general fund. Wood and Primbsch will work on the tax return.

Secretary Jenkins reported on mail received (GPC + junk).

Station Manager Gleason talked about the roof status.

Education: Fowler reported success in scheduling a General class for the spring, beginning March 29, at West Contra Costa Adult Education. Fowler also reported on a message handling training session at SATERN in Clayton for February 19.

Webmaster Hoffman reported posting a PDF file of January's presentation on our website.

President Fowler commented on the recent Richmond Parks & Recreation Commission meeting, and a plan for Nichol Park. Creating a presentation about EBARC was discussed. A possible alternate location for the club station was discussed. Fowler also discussed the possibility of putting a new roof on the club station. Fowler reported that the Executive Committee was working on a cooperative agreement with Contra Costa Red Cross. Ken stated that we need to get Field Day teams organized. Propagation in the coming solar cycle may not be as exciting as earlier predicted. The Hornet ARC meets next Saturday morning, visitors are welcome.

Jack Burris and Ron Smith commented on the upcoming School Round-up. New members and guests were announced. Texx Woodworth commented on the Grizzly Peak Century on May 1, and on working on a possible back-up location for the club station. Texx also commented on the Community Center proposal at the Manor School site.

The next meeting is March 11, 2011. There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 20:06.

A presentation was made by Steve Bjork, KI6JJW on "My APRS Station." President Fowler presented Steve with a Certificate of Appreciation.
