Amateur Radio License Class Preparation for Technician License

Class will meet from 6:30 to 8:30 p.m. on Tuesdays from March 25 through June 3. The final session of the class will be an exam session conducted by the EBARC VE team, for the usual fee of \$15. Textbook is *The ARRL Ham Radio License Manual, Second Edition,* available from the instructor for \$27. Register for course 2003500 with West Contra Costa Adult Education, 6028 Ralston Ave, Richmond 94805, (510) 215-4666. Course fee is \$15. Class will meet at Alvarado School, 5625 Sutter St., Richmond.

This class is intended to prepare students who do not hold an existing Amateur Radio License for passing the FCC Examination for Technician Class Amateur License. Topics include: FCC regulations, radio communications, radio equipment, and operating an Amateur Radio station.

Note: A new question pool for the Technician Class License will go into effect on June 30, 2014.

VE Session for 83 at UCB Sharon Primbsch, AA6XZ

On February 26th, 21 local ARRL Volunteer Examiners held a humongous test session at the University of California at Berkeley. It was for a group of 83 Electrical Engineering Digital Signal Processing students and others. Several things were done to streamline this session, including beforehand and afterward. The VEs managed 89 elements in about 3 hours. That's about half a minute per exam element! 74 candidates earned Tech tickets. 6 earned General, and only 3 went home unlicensed (no retests were permitted). We had lots of help (snacks, parking permits, preregistration, logistics, etc.) from the EE Department and from hams of the campus club, W6BB.

General Meeting Minutes February 14, 2014 Robin Spalding, N6RLS, Secretary

Opening: President Ken Fowler called the meeting to order at 7:32 p.m. Sign-in sheet was circulated, members and a guest signed in. A round of self-introductions was made. Minutes of the January 10, 2014 General meeting were approved as published in *The Blown Fuse*.

Program: First Vice-President Ron Smith reported that the March presentation will have two fellows from the Marin Club talk about *Life After the End of Microsoft XP Support*. April's Presentation will be Jack Burris & Bill Mitchell on Antenna Building and Analyzing. Bill offered members to get in on a bulk toroid order he's making: 2.4" #31 ferrite toroids.

Hospitality: Second Vice-President Jay Sparks submitted a bill for goodies already paid for. Tonight's kitty took in \$8.00.

Membership: Third Vice-President Sharon Primbsch: *Blown Fuse* will include a club roster for both print and email subscribers. A discussion of pros & cons of posting the roster online or even by email followed. Possible Executive Board action will follow.

Finance: Treasurer Randy Jenkins reported: Monthly income (January) was \$278.72; expenses were \$601.27 (\$552.00 for liability & equipment insurance). General fund balance was \$3827.18; Station fund balance was \$2879.14.

Secretary: Secretary Robin Spalding reported no mail of significance received.

Station Manager: Stanton Gleason was absent.

Public Events/Education: Randy Jenkins reported Grizzly Peak Century 1st Sunday in May, and Boy Scouts Hike 1st Sat., June 7th. **Web Page**: Webmaster Peter Hoffman reported updated contact info and posted links for his presentation last month. He also mentioned bogus "exceeded bandwidth" website message.

President: Ken Fowler reported interesting propagation recently; high sunspot numbers and DX on 10 meters every day. He worked a Namibia station.

Also: Richmond Rec. has announced our need to quickly vacate our club station location in Richmond – by the end of April.

Possibilities: Abandoning the idea of having a physical club station / Having a RACES type operation in the basement of City Hall / having a station in the Rigger's Loft near the *Red Oak Victory* ship.

Meantime: We need to close out our current station. Some members met there last Wednesday to start triaging things into keep, sell, discard, send to e-waste, etc.

We may have a swap meet at this location (Library) before next month's meeting for items we don't plan to keep.

We need immediate storage location(s) for stuff we're keeping – Randy noted Marin Club offered to store our antennas (outdoors) for up to two years.

Anyone with personal items at Richmond Station needs to retrieve them ASAP.

Discussions followed: Rigger's Loft space/location details; how things are being separated at the station; that little regard to walls etc. is required considering the imminent destruction of the building. History of the station: HF Contest station and Red Cross Disaster control center; Red Cross left 10 years ago. EOC: details of the space being offered to us; importance of EOC City Hall location as opposed to other locations, such as near *Red Oak Victory* ship (which could also be an EOC location); EmComm as a primary (or not) function of EBARC; Background of Richmond's EOC and EmComm planning; Proposed City Hall basement would have 12 operating positions (each w/ computer + Internet and a radio) - 2 would be EBARC, 1 would be CCCC/RACES, 1 would be CERT. Big problem: long distance to rooftop antenna from basement radios (signal loss); Ken proposes RC from the basement to rooflocated transmitters for HF and VHF/UHF operations by remote control until we get a firm HF location. Would RACES (non EBARC members) operate our equipment in an emergency?

Discussion: Is EmComm a mission of EBARC? No, it's a special interest. According to our Bylaws we're not limited to only one club "station" location. Better chance of having HF operation (antennas) near *Red Oak Victory* (even operated remotely from City Hall). We could have multiple station locations. Question for our Membership: Should EBARC become an EmComm-focused club? Ken proposed "field trip" to Rigger's Loft (near *Red Oak Victory*) to assess its possibilities for EBARC. Could we have our meetings there? How much space would we have?

EBARC Field Day in June: Any thoughts? (Nothing offered) We put a temporary reservation for the Cesar Chavez Park location; we need a FD coordinator to take charge of the planning.

Jeff Miller, KJ6RHF, has been offered & has accepted the open Member-At Large position on the Board.

Announcements: RSVP's due for the Mark Nowell, WI7YN service on March 1st. Jack Burris, K6JEB, Peter Hoffman, W6DEI are involved with the January 2016 Heard Island DXpedition, VK0EK. Rich Holoch, KY6R is going there. Get your antennas ready. Volunteers are needed. www.heardisland.org

W6BB Centennial is underway and will operate Mar 21-28 as W6C. Wednesday evening, Feb 26th: ARRL VE's are wanted to help with oncampus exams at UC Berkeley.

Mar 25th is start of Ken's Tech Classes (which includes a VE session). Only 9 weeks are available at West County Adult Education. Ken asked if other VE sessions are options. Our class is a better option than various "ham crams" being offered elsewhere.

Next Meeting: the next meeting will be on March 14, 2014.

Closing: There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 8:42 p.m.

Presentation: After a break for refreshments, Simon Poulton, KK6IJZ gave an interesting and informative talk about the details of Linrad Software Defined radio. His computer, having undergone a software upgrade earlier in the day, was not cooperating with his Linrad app, so his presentation was verbal only.
