General Meeting Minutes April 11, 2014 Robin Spalding, N6RLS, Secretary

Opening: The meeting at the El Sobrante Library was called to order at 7:40 p.m. by President Fowler. Sign-in sheet was circulated. A round of self-introductions was made. Minutes of the March, 2014 General Meeting were approved as published in *The Blown Fuse*.

Program: First Vice-President Ron Smith reported that tonight's program will be about the antenna Bill Mitchell & Jack Burris built for

W6BB, and about using the new EBARC antenna analyzer to check it out & make adjustments to it. Next Month Rich Holoch, KY6R, will talk about an antenna he built and the modeling software he used to design it. June will feature a discussion of Field Day, with the FD-5000 Simulator.

Hospitality: Second Vice-President Sparks noted a delightful assortment of pastries tonight – lots of new herbal tea – and please feed the kitty.

Membership: Third Vice-President Primbsch on vacation. Ken noted Sharon has VE session scheduled on the last Sunday in April. Randy noted two renewed memberships.

Finance: Treasurer Jenkins reported club financial information. General fund balance was \$4,224.91; Station fund balance was \$2,945.65. Monthly income was \$105.75; expenses were \$126.77. Station Fund had income of \$66.23 (mostly equip. sales)

Secretary: Secretary Spalding reported no correspondence of significance forwarded from Treasurer.

Station Manager: Gleason absent. Ken noted station being removed in steps. The Red Cross tower is down and antennas from other towers are down. Equipment being kept is being moved to a temporary storage locker. A yard sale is set for 26 April at the club station to sell off gear and items not being kept. Help needed on next two weekends to help with further antenna and tower removal.

Public Events/Education: Jenkins noted two events: Grizzly Peak bike ride is 1st Sun of May. Fages II Boy Scout hike is moved to May 31st. Help is needed with both events. Ken noted Tech class continuing with eleven students. Some "Ham Cram" grads are taking the class to learn more about the hobby. Members are welcome to sit in on classes or help with instruction.

Web Page: Webmaster Hoffman absent.

President: Fowler mentioned that a survey is being put together to poll the EBARC membership as to their preferred day & time for the monthly Club meeting (in response to a member's desire to have it on a day other than Friday). Survey Monkey may be used.

Also, the Rigger's Loft is an unknown quantity for a possible space for our club. There is no action on using the basement of Richmond City Hall for our club station.

New Members and Guests: Ken said some might be outside helping set up an antenna for tonight's talk.

Announcements: Ron noted the ARRL 100th Anniversary activities involving W1AW/x stations working from all 50 states this year (each state twice) for a week at a time. Ron looking to work all states this way. Randy noted that Marin Club welcomes any EBARC members to help with their Field Day. Ken extended similar welcome from USS Hornet ARC's FD activities.

Next Meeting: The next general meeting will be on May 9th, 2014. Meeting place for the Board meeting next month is to tba.

Closing: There being no further business, the membership meeting was adjourned at 8:06 p.m.

Presentation: After a break for refreshments, Bill Mitchell presented an account of how he and Jack Burris built a resonant feed dipole antenna for the W6BB Amateur Radio Club. They detailed the issues encountered in making it as resonant and efficient as possible, using the new EBARC antenna analyzer. His slides are now on the EBARC website. After the slides & talk, members went outside to see the antenna in action. (The antenna had been strung up in the trees before the meeting started.)

We can't afford to store it, and we don't want to see it go to landfill.

Equipment will be sold "as is" with no warranty. Available items include VHF and UHF radios, VHF and UHF antennas, power supplies, coax cables, chairs, motor generator sets, test equipment, books, miscellaneous hardware, and lots of junk.
