General Meeting Minutes April 8, 2011 Sharon Primbsch, AA6XZ, Acting Sec'ty

The meeting was called to order at 7:31 p.m. by President Ken Fowler. A round of introductions was the first order of business.

The minutes of the March general meeting were accepted as printed in "The Blown Fuse."

Membership: Sharon Primbsch reported that Don Pool joined EBARC at this meeting. He has no license yet, and is currently studying in EBARC's class.

Newsletter: Sharon reported that the next issue will be for May and June. She encouraged everyone to get articles to her early, especially for Field Day.

Treasurer: John Wood reported that the balances at the end of March were \$3,712.16 in the general fund and \$4,797.00 in the station fund. There was a \$500 donation to the roofing fund from Pamela Coville. The EBARC Federal tax return has been filed (we are not federally tax exempt). We are not required to file a California return (we are a California charitable trust). No taxes are due for 2010.

Secretary: Randy Jenkins was not present. Ken Fowler led a discussion of a letter that EBARC received from NARCC's Spectrum Management Committee. This committee wants feedback on their plan to take over management of all frequencies above 29 MHz in Northern California.

President: Ken discussed a proposal to reallocate some frequencies (this is being considered in Congress). See the ARRL website for details. Make your views known to ARRL, and they will lobby Congress.

Education: Ken discussed the General license class we're holding every Tuesday evening until June 7th at Alvarado Adult School. There are eleven students now. There will also be Wednesday evening classes for those now in the General class who do not already have a Technician license. Ken needs help teaching!

Volunteer Examiners: Sharon reported that there's a VE session in Oakland April 17th.

Club Station: Stanton Gleason reported that we have ordered materials for reroofing the club station. A generator has been donated,

but it needs some work. Stanton requests help with the generator refurbishing.

Field Day: Jack Burris reported that we need a SSB Station Manager for Field Day.

Show and Tell: Mathison Ott showed a multiband 3 – 30 MHz software-defined receiver kit that sells for about \$56. You get a waterfall display of the spectrum. A transmitter kit is also available. See kb9yig.com for more information.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:05 p.m. for refreshments, and a program by Jason Spence, KF6RGF.

Everyone Can Play in RACES May 21st Exercise! Michael McMillan, K6MCM

The next RACES Exercise with Simulated Traffic (REST 1105) will be held on Saturday morning, May 21, from 8:30 to 10:30 am. The task will be to relay messages using simplex from one end of the county to the other (from Bethel Island to Richmond, for example).

We have 22 stations set to participate, including Richmond, San Pablo, El Cerrito, Pinole, and Kensington. You don't have to be a RACES member to participate. Email Mike McMillan (K6MCM@arrl.net) to join in or for more information.

The exercise will operate something like a QSO contest in that the goal will be to obtain a specific message from each of the 22 stations using only simplex and relaying between stations as necessary. It should be a fun learning experience.

Petition to NARCC to Save Simplex Frequencies

On January 29, 2011, the NARCC Board approved a plan to reduce the number of simplex frequencies from 26 to 13 and to use the spectrum of those released 13 simplex frequencies for digital repeaters.

If you do not accept frequency recommendations from NARCC outside the repeater segments of the band plan, you may wish to sign the petition that's available on the EBARC web site, www.eastbayarc.org. Go to the site, click on "Current Events" and see the two documents listed under "NARCC's simplex frequency..." The petitions must be received by NARCC in time for their May 7th annual meeting.

this decision. It takes an enormous amount of work and resource to make these swaps successful, and, as a club, we have witnessed a steady decline in both revenue and manpower to make the swap a worthwhile venture.

We greatly appreciate your support over the years. It has been a fun ride while it lasted. LARK would especially like to thank all those who volunteered and rose at the crack of dawn on Sunday mornings to get the swap meet up and running to provide this fun and rewarding event for the amateur radio community at large. The swap will be missed.
