

## General Meeting Minutes September 10, 2010 Randy Jenkins, KA6BQF, Secretary

The meeting was called to order at 19:35 hours by President Ken Fowler. There was a sign-in sheet available. Seventeen members and guests were in attendance. A round of introductions was the first order of business.

#### **ODDS and ENDS from KO6NO**

A few months back, I promised to publish some links to sources of design software that I use for circuit design. The programs I have been using are ExpressSCH for drawing schematics and ExpressPCB to draw the circuit boards. Both programs are available free in a package from http://expresspcb.com/. You can draw the schematic for your design with ExpressSCH using part symbols from the included library of standard parts. You can also create symbols for parts or modify the library parts. You then create circuit board artwork with ExpressPCB and then have boards manufactured by uploading the design files to ExpressPCB. You receive very good quality circuit boards in about 10 days. I also use ExpressSCH to draw schematics and wiring diagrams for equipment, even when I don't need a circuit board. Express PCB is also good for laying out panels

and general drawing. Both programs will require some effort to learn how to use their features.

I enjoyed the CCCC / EBARC picnic this month. It was good to see so many of you and share the good food. The only problem is that since I went on my exercise and diet program last year, I can't eat as much as I once did. But the BBQ and corn were great.
