# General Meeting Minutes August 8, 2014 Robin Spalding, N6RLS, Secretary

**Opening:** The meeting was called to order at 7:30 p.m. by President Fowler. Sign-in sheet was circulated, 15 members and a guest signed in. A round of self-introductions was made. Minutes of the July, 2014 meeting were approved, as published in *The Blown Fuse*.

**Program:** First Vice-President Ron Smith reported that tonight's program will be Joe Fisher, K5EJL, on MESH networking. September's program will be Harry Styron, K6HS – Contra Costa County Sheriff Department's Auxiliary Communications System. The October program (during Pacificon) is to be announced.

**Hospitality:** Stanton filling in for Jay. Please "Feed the Kitty."

**Membership:** Third Vice-President Primbsch reported deadline for *The Blown Fuse* comes early; next Tuesday! She also asked members to please respond to the emailed survey re: changing the club's day and/or time for monthly meetings. We have new members: Hal Graboske, KK6NDF, and Jim Fast, KK6NDG.

**Finance:** Treasurer Jenkins reported club financial information: General Fund spent \$10.21 more than it took in. Station Fund spent \$1.88 more than we

brought in. We earned 12 cents interest for the quarter. We're still solvent.

**Secretary:** Secretary Spalding reported no incoming mail received.

**Station Manager:** Gleason reported the club station is pretty much gone.

**Public Events/Education:** Jenkins mentioned Holstein 100 event in far west Marin, 3 others in Marin, and a couple in Sonoma. There's nothing around here.

**Web Page:** Webmaster Hoffman reported updating website wording to indicate we're looking to relocate the club station.

**President:** Fowler reported status of the W6CUS Club Station: It's all packed away. Storage locker has Field Day gear and some club records. The station building still has some trash in it, possibly some historical items and auxiliary equipment. There are office chairs & misc. building materials as well. The 45' Rohn Tower still needs to come down. We need a crew to lower that antenna and also move the 75' Tri-X tower (laying on the ground) to Marin. Truck or trailer needed. City of Richmond had been talking of providing some EOC space for us. That's on hold until further notice. Demolition of the club building hasn't yet happened. Possibly the Richmond Rec. Dept. budget has been trimmed. We might have vacated earlier than we needed to. We're working on reducing storage costs of our equipment (\$77/mo). Looking to store stuff at people's houses, within the next month. The Executive Committee voted at this point of the general meeting to cut PG&E service. (Stanton will take care of this, as the bill is in his name).

License class for General class license runs September 9<sup>th</sup> to Dec 9<sup>th</sup> on Tuesdays 6:30 - 8:30 p.m. at Alvarado Adult School, 5625 Sutter St., Richmond. More details are on the EBARC website.

We need members to run for EBARC Board positions for next year: President, and 1st VP (Programs) officers are stepping down. Other positions also open to new members, including Secretary.

**New Member:** Hal Grabowske, KK6NDF, was introduced.

**Announcements:** Sharon reminded us about the new FCC ruling. Expired General, Advanced, and Extra licensees can now easily get General or Extra licenses. This requires proof of their former license and taking only the Technician test at a VE session. Details are on the EBARC website.

Next Meeting: September 12, 2014.

**Closing:** There being no further business, the general meeting was adjourned at 8:00 p.m.

**Presentation:** After a break for refreshments, our Austin, TX member, Joe Fisher, K5EJL, gave an extensive and interesting overview of the MESH networking system, with live demos of the gear involved. He also flashed the MESH OS onto gear brought by members and guests.
