**August 2021 General Minutes** Todd Teachout, W8BIK, Secretary

The EBARC General Meeting was held August 13, 2021, virtually, via the Zoom internet conferencing application as a result of COVID-19 pandemic restrictions. 28 people attended. The President called the meeting to order at 7:32 p.m.

An agenda was distributed via e-mail on 8/13/2021.

The President welcomed attendees. He told the group that member Ron Smith,KE6RS, experienced a stroke and was recovering at Smith Ranch Rehab Center in San Rafael. All expressed kind thoughts for Ron and the best for a speedy recovery. Jay asked people to introduce themselves. He indicated the meeting today would include a presentation by Rick Ellis about *Summits on the Air* and *Parks on the Air*.

#### Officer Reports

President: Jay reported that an effort is underway to further evaluate several in-person meeting sites. The location selected may necessitate changing the club meeting day and/or time from the current 2<sup>nd</sup> Friday of the month at 7:30 p.m. The COVID delta variant has caused the cancellation of a September picnic that was being organized in collaboration with the 4C's. Jay announced that the two oscilloscopes offered to members last month received no takers from club members. These items will be removed from inventory and salvaged/recycled. He reported the club has two transceivers, an ICOM 731 and an ICOM 751 that have missing parts (power cables and microphone). It is uncertain if these radios work. Jay offered them to members, "as-is" on a first come, first serve. Contact Jay if you're interested

Secretary: Todd reported that the draft July 2021 EBARC general meeting minutes were published in the August 2021 Blown Fuse newsletter. He reported receiving no correction requests. He recommended that the group approve the Minutes. Motion to approve by Todd. Second by Katie. Minutes approved by affirmation.

3rd VP-Membership/Newsletter/VE Testing: Sharon reported the deadline for the September *Blown Fuse* newsletter is August 23<sup>rd</sup>. No new members joined EBARC in the last month. Due to pandemic restrictions the VE session in Oakland did not occur in July. The October session is very uncertain given the impact of the COVID delta variant. She is still trying to verify that the past test site location in Oakland is still available, but awaits a response. She expressed thanks to all members who responded to the request for help to narrow down the list of locations for a new in-person meeting place.

Treasurer: No Report.

1st VP Programs: Katie announced that a survey is expected to be sent to members soon to try to determine how best the club should move forward. Hopefully the responses will improve on how the club meets the needs of the current members and appeal to other amateur licensees in the area enough so they want to join. Tonight's presentation will be about the *Summits on the Air Program*.

2<sup>nd</sup> VP Hospitality. No Report.

#### **Announcements**

2<sup>nd</sup> VP, Martin indicated that he and some others will be trying to launch another pico balloon radio at the Berkeley Marina/Caesar Chavez Park at 8:00 a.m. on Saturday 8/14/2021.

Secretary Todd mentioned that this weekend is the *QSO Today* virtual conference. He encouraged members to check it out. Admission is \$12.

#### **New Business**

Members Roster Distribution: The digital EBARC membership roster was distributed to members on July 17, 2021. The list was accidentally misused to announce a Richmond

CERT training program related to emergency evacuation. The way the announcement was made allowed invitees to be visible to unauthorized agents. Several recipients reported receiving unwanted spam e-mails and were deeply offended. The sender has apologized. Executive Committee members apologized to offended members for this unfortunate act. The September *Blown Fuse* newsletter will have further guidance to prevent this from happening again.

#### **Program**

1st VP Katie introduced Rick Ellis, K6TOR, a member of the San Francisco Amateur Radio Club. Rick talked about the Summits on the Air (SOTA) and the *Parks on the Air* (POTA) awards programs. SOTA rewards efforts to transmit from mountain tops as well as make contacts with these people. POTA similarly rewards efforts to transmit and make contacts with people operating from parks. To get credit one needs to make at least four contacts on SOTA and ten contacts on POTA. Rick mentioned the equipment he uses with regard to transceiver, antenna, keys, and batteries. He also talked about other equipment that he has seen other operators use. Rick enjoys making SOTA contacts in the HF bands via the CW mode. He indicated that FM and SSB are also popular. He showed the group several photos from recent events nearby (Angel Island and Pt. Reyes) and in remote areas of the Sierras. The appeal of SOTA ops is that it gives him a reason to get outdoors and exercise. He reported that SOTA or POTA can be done with varying amounts of walking from modest to challenging. His experiences have tended to be all day efforts. Occasionally he's done overnight camping excursions. He compared a SOTA day to a day at an 18-hole golf course. Both can include up to 6 miles of walking. You can also get credit for acknowledging a SOTA/POTA CQ from home. When operating at a popular park or managed wilderness area, Rick recommended that you notify the rangers or other officials to explain

the activity before they have to respond to reports then seek you out to investigate.

Rick has created a SOTA/POTA go-bag that weighs about 25 lbs. for a day operation. The contents include radios (main and a handitalkie), batteries (2-6Ahr and 3Ahr), antenna, tools, a laptop, a CW key, a jacket, 2 quarts of water, sunblock, hat, snack. Sometimes he packs a collapsible pole, guy rope and stakes. The radio gear weighs about 10 lbs. Comfort and refreshment gear weighs about 15 lbs. Overnight packs get into the 40 lbs. range.

To speed the contact process, both POTA and SOTA have spotting tools. With them you can announce that you're operating. Spotting can also be done with SMS (cell phone text) messaging and APRS messaging. Contacts can be as basic as sharing your ID (Call Sign), signal report, and location. It can be more involved as well. It is important to be spotted.

Rick sometimes coordinates activities using a Slack channel. The San Francisco Amateur Radio Club has a Slack channel with several subareas including SOTA and POTA.

Rick encouraged viewers to try SOTA/POTA in a small group. He finds it to be really fun.
