A reminder that your ALERT (Altadena Local Emergency Radio Team) net meets Monday 03.23.2015 @ 8 PM. Net control is Jay KK6RAV with Nancee K8NBD as back up.

After 8PM net we will move to one of the Alta simplex frequencies. LISTEN TO NET CONTROL Clearly give your location so we can determine who we can reach/hear on simplex. BE PREPARED TO RELAY CHECK-INS TO NET CONTROL. When you check out during net closing roll call let net control know if you plan to practice on simplex as just that remaining roll call will be taken on each simplex. We will return to TELCO after the last simplex check-in. List of ALERT simplex frequencies used for emergency use are listed at the end of this e-mail. Give the tactical name to the simplex as in Alta 1, or Alta 2 and so on. Do give the actual frequency location. NOTE: ALTA 3 is now at a different frequency

An invitation for DCS, including the application, was sent out on 03.13.2015. The invitation is again attached to this e-mail. Please, consider how you can help with this effort to bridge our community to the Sheriff Station.

For those you on our vast and varied ALERT e-mail list; first, thank you for your interest in radio communication. Second, you may earn your license on the second Saturday every month at the Huntington Memorial Hospital, Wingate Building @ 11:00AM. The exam class is held after the monthly 9AM ARES meeting. Please, come prepared to take the exam with the appropriate ID, and FCC information. Please, e-mail me at k8nbd@arrl.net if you need more information. Third, when you have earned your amateur radio license learn how to your radio and become active in your local community. Your trained and practiced service will be valued during any critical event. We will had to learn how to use "the radio" so we all can help you get over the jitters . ACTIVITY DAY is a great place to have your radio questions answered: generally the fourth Saturday of every month also at the Memorial Hospital in room 5/6 in the hospital cafeteria.

Summary information from Sheriff Department (DCS):

There is not set schedule for DCS training, it depends on the number of applicants and what stage of the hiring process they are in. After the DCS application has been submitted (with supporting documents such as the HAM license and copy of CDL) they will be scheduled for DCS/LASD orientation training, also known as Prospective Member Training. They will then complete the LIVE SCAN request and start working on their FEMA courses before they can become full members. We are currently trying to streamline the process so that it can be done in as little as three months.

Your next ALERT meeting is WEDNESDAY, **APRIL 08 on @ 7:30 PM** @ the Altadena Town and country Club in the downstairs card room. 2290 Country Club Drive Altadena CA 91001 off of Mendocino and Hill Avenue.

Everyone interested in radio may attend our monthly meetings. You do not need to have your amateur radio license in order to attend this meeting. See you soon, and hear from you even sooner. Steve N6SPR presented information about locations of our active radio operators through a mapping program. IT WILL BE HELPFUL TO HAVE AS MANY RADIO PAOPLE INVOLVED IN OUR PRACTICE (NET) AS POSSIBLE SO WHEN "A CRITICAL EVENT" HAPPENS WE ARE ALL READY TO COMMUNICATE A SENSE OF CALM WITH OPTIONS FOR ASSISTANCE.

It is critical that ALERT people practice being net control. Let me know when you are ready for your turn and I will send you the latest script and the current roster. We have many radio people who listen but do not check-in, remember that your check in with your call sign and location will tell us the reach of the ALERT net.

Your check in also serves as a practice for your radio equipment, what is working or what needs to be worked on. Try checking in with your HT or a new antenna... practice, practice. The general net takes about 20 minutes with the optional, always interesting and helpful, after net discussion taking from 15-30 minutes.
