TORNADO SAFETY TIPS

Thunderstorms with their deadly lightning, heavy rain, destructive winds, and hail are the "advanced men" for the most violent storm on earth –

THE TORNADO

REMEMBER THESE INSTRUCTIONS DURING THE TORNADO SEASON:

TORNADO WATCH: This alert condition means that weather conditions in your area are favorable to produce tornadoes. Stay alert and informed by monitoring the weather in your area and keeping your radio or TV on.

TORNADO WARNING This alert condition means that a tornado has been reported or detected on radar and that you should <u>seek safe</u> shelter immediately.

A basement offers the best shelter. Seek shelter under a stairway or sturdy furniture. In homes without basements, seek shelter in the center of the home on the lowest floor, in a small room or closet, bathroom or interior hallway.

IN A MOBILE HOME Go to a prearranged safe shelter. If there is no time, lie flat in a ditch or depression, upwind from the mobile home. DO NOT REMAIN IN THE MOBILE HOME.

IN A VEHICLE If there is time, travel right angles to the tornado's path. If there is no time to drive away, get out of the vehicle and into a safe shelter or a ditch or depression up wind from the vehicle.

AT WORK OR SCHOOL Follow advanced shelter plans to move into interior hallways or small rooms on the lowest level. <u>AVOID</u>

AREAS WITH WINDOWS AND OR LARGE SPAN ROOFS.

IN OPEN COUNTRYTake shelter in a sturdy building if possible or lie flat in a ditch or depression and hold on to something anchored in the ground. MAKE SURE YOUR ARE UPWIND FROM ANY VEHICLE OR POSSIBLE DEBRIS.

SIREN WARNING Three to five minutes of a steady siren tone means <u>tornado warning</u> during the tornado season. During the rest of the year, it means <u>"alert"</u> tune to local radio and TV stations for information.

SIREN TESTS In the Plymouth area and most other areas, siren tests are conducted on the first Saturday of each month at 1 PM local time. The test consists of 1 minute of steady tone.

Please don't call the Police or Fire Departments for storm information during a Watch or Warning. You will just tie up their emergency phone lines. Contact your local Emergency Management Office during normal business hours.
