



Minutes of the November 19, 2014

CIRC Meeting

The regularly scheduled meeting of CIRC was called to order by President, Grant Zehr (AA9LC) at 7:00 PM, November 19, 2014.

Guests present included Jerry Comer (KB9ZDY) of Parrish, FL.

It was noted that the minutes of the regular October 2014 meeting had been sent by email to all members on the CIRC reflector. On motion by Tom Planer (KJ9P) and second by Gary Huber (AB9M), the minutes were unanimously approved.

On behalf of Treasurer Kathy Huber, Norm Huber (N9ZKS) submitted a written report to the members that indicated a balance on hand of \$1,601.74 as of meeting date. Norm also prepared a report of expenditures by category of expense for the year to date. On motion by Mike Sallee (KC9FWL) and

seconded by Keith Hanson (AC9S), the Treasurer's Report was unanimously approved.

Ed Deutsch indicated the slate of primary and backup net control operators for the Tuesday night 2 meters net had been completed and the program was ready to go forward..

Radio room manager, Norm Huber, indicated that if the weather was OK on Saturday, he would like help putting up the feed line to the off center dipole.

Keith Hanson reminded everyone that the December meeting, which is a Christmas dinner for members and spouses, will be 6:00 PM December 3, 2014 at the Ozark House.

Grant Zehr indicated that the club pages for W9EX and W9AML had no manager assigned to them and were blank. Grant agreed to be manager and activated the pages. He is soliciting photos and other information to populate the pages.

Norm Huber reminded everyone of the ARES meeting to be held on December 4th at 7 PM. The clubs future participation with that organization will be discussed.

Keith Hanson brought up a concern that current dues may be set at a level that discourages future growth in membership. After some discussion, there was a consensus that the officers would discuss this and bring one or more proposals to the next meeting.

Grant Zehr commented that the use of the MFJ (and possibly other) antenna analyzers in a rich RF field may cause inaccurate readings.

On motion by Tom Planer and second by Ed Deutsch, the meeting was unanimously adjourned.

The WX9WX D-Star repeater has been working quite nicely since the Raspberry PI power supply was replaced. Coverage, with a handheld, is very good also.

A few of us are already making new friends in the Decatur, Illinois area as we have been connecting the WX9WX system to the Decatur D-Star system.

A real thrill has been chatting with a Ham from Scotland on D-Star! You just don't know who may show up on frequency.

The current repeater system is Kenwood based equipment and a challenge to align and modify for amateur use.

Under the guidance and mentoring of Michael, KG9DW, I have finished a Motorola based system which is software programmable and adjustable which makes the Motorola system better suited for what we are experimenting with.
