From the President

Well; time sure flies when your chasing DX on HF and it is near the end of February already and I apologize to the CIRC members for not adding words of wit or wisdom to the past newsletters as I just can't think of any right now. My XYL has been keeping me busy with household duties in-between my hamming fun on HF. As many already know we have lost another CIRC member and good friend Dave Roberts KE9BA as he became a SK as of February 18th at 4:10PM.

I have been actively pursuing the local restoration company that removed all of our CIRC radio club equipment at the Red Cross after the building became slightly flooded in the basement and fears of mold and things concerned Red Cross enough to call in a restoration company that not only cleaned out the full basement of Red Cross supplies but also cleared out our CIRC radio room equipment too and shipped it all North to Michigan for processing. In the last few weeks we have received some of the radio equipment back and we are keeping track of our club inventory with the sheets that Tom and Norm developed and this was a great list to have in our passion off site. Without this list we really could not have accounted for a lot of the gear and documentation and this inventory list has made keeping track of what gear we now have back and what is still missing. It is a ongoing process and I will keep everyone posted on the W9AML reflector website.

I'd like to remind everyone that the ARES net and the W9AML Tuesday night nets are still active and mark your calendar to stop by and check in even if you do not have any traffic if still shows your support for these nets. The ARES net is at 8PM on 146.79 WD9HRU repeater and the W9AML net is at 9PM on the 146.94 CIRC club repeater. Also, inbetween the two nets there is local gathering of hams on HF on 10 meters at 28.450 and this informal round table of rag chewing starts around 8PM and goes on till everyone runs out of things to

talk about. There is also a Thursday night 10 meter rag chew on 28.450 called Vertical Thursday and it is a fun evening when everyone try's to use a vertical antenna, but anything that you can hook up to and get to load on 10 meters will do and it also starts around 8PM on Thursday.

I wanted to thank Gary Huber AB9M and Tom KJ9P for getting me steered back into using cw again and I have been having great fun finding many island Dx-peditions that use CW more so than SSB and so many hams in smaller out of the way places only use CW and so many operators only use homebrew equipment and their only mode is CW. I have snagged so many really neat DX stations these last few months and when the band is down and out for SSB CW and Digital get though. Gary clued me in to a really neat high speed CW Decoder called CWskimmer and I found out that other CW ops in the area use a program called CWget and both are excellent decoding programs for high speed CW and most DXpeditions stay at 30 to 35 wpm and although I can now hear my call and report and other standard DX exchanges, the decoders really help. My old brain starts a log jam on cw at around 20wpm and the decoders are a must have to copy DX-peditions for me. They run at this speed to maximize contacts worked in the short time periods they active a rare island or country. Give these two programs a try and get your feet wet again in CW.

I just finished a total restoration of a Hallicrafters HT-37 transmitter and after getting the coves bead blasted down to bare metal and then a couple of coats of primer and then 4 coats of color paint wet sanding with a block in-between coats of paint and letting the sun bake each coat and a final hand polish of the paint with auto polishing compound the cabinet came out looking better than new and you could see your face in the paint shine. I made a ham operator happy in Ohio and just now finishing up doing the same to the matching Hallicrafters HT-41 linear that has all new tubes and will have the same thing done to the cabinet making it look and work like new. Old boat anchor radios are my Achilles Heel next to chasing DX.

On a final note; spring is approaching and so is our next Field Day outing and all ideas and suggestions on tis fun event are always welcome. I hope to see you all at the next club meeting and please remember to pay your club dues if you have not done so yet.

Central Illinois Radio Club Jan 2016 Meeting Minutes

The January 2016 regularly scheduled meeting of CIRC was called to order by President Dennis Mills (KE9UA) at 7:00 PM on January 27, 2016. Dennis began the meeting with self introductions of all members and guests present and the passing of a sign-in list. Twenty-four members were present.

Secretary Mike Sallee (KC9FWL) read the November meeting minutes. It was noted that the call sign for

Josh Golladay is wrong. {Corrected by secretary}. On motion by Gary Huber (AB9M), and second by Norm Huber (N9ZKS), the minutes were unanimously approved. Kathy Huber (KC9SKF) gave the financial report. The current cash balance was \$2,948.90. On motion by Grant Zehr (AA9LC), and second by Ed

Deutsch (KC9GF), the Treasurer's report was unanimously approved.

Old Business

1. Dennis discussed his audit of missing equipment and club money that was given to members to purchase equipment for the club. The club has provided members with \$1,928.50, but Dennis was only able to account for \$903. So we have \$1,025.50 that was spent, but we do not have the equipment that was purchased. We discussed legal actions to get the equipment. The Secretary was asked to resend a letter to one member by Certified Mail.

2. Keith Hanson (AC9S), chairperson of the new Repeater Committee, reported on their recommendations. We could move the repeater to a new location, but the ERP is limited because of interference with the repeater in Kankakee. Short

Term we will install the equipment to provide a control link for the repeater. Those authorized to use the control will be limited to the club officers. Long Term we should find another location and frequency. We should consider using a Fusion System, which can be analog or digital. We already have a D-Star repeater in town available for anyone's use. Tom Planer (KJ9P) made a motion that Short Term we keep the current repeater as analog and consider the other FM recommendations as possible future changes. After a second by Gary H, the motion was unanimously approved.

New Business 1. Dennis reviewed the recent flooding problems in the basement of the Red Cross building. They hired a restoration company to handle the restoration of supplies and the building. Mold was found. Our radio station was part of the equipment that was removed. It took some research to locate a responsible person at the Red Cross in Peoria. Dennis notified her about our concerns about how they did mold remediation to the equipment. Thanks to Tom and Norm for using the inventory master list to determine what equipment was moved. Many of the pieces of equipment have been returned and inspected. Some of it was

damaged when it was moved. Overall, the Red Cross will provide the money for repair or replacement via their insurance.

We do not know if we will be able to have the space in the basement so we can rebuild our station. We are also still working with the Red Cross to find missing equipment. We need to review the MOU between the Red Cross and the ARRL at the national level and also the MOU we have with the local chapter. Dennis will keep the membership updated on the equipment via the Reflector.

2. We discussed the need to complete the purchase of insurance for our equipment via the ARRL. Duane Benjamin (KC9PIM) will be asked to get the insurance when he returns from vacation later in February

Ed made a motion that we get the insurance by March. After a second by Keith, the motion was unanimously approved.

3. Keith routed a sheet for people to record what they would like to have for presentations at future meetings. Dennis read the list and some addition suggestions were added.

Dennis called for a break for food, drink and visiting between members.

Dennis started the meeting again.

4 Jim Baker (WB9GDL) said he would be getting information soon for the Wheelers Bicycle ride and

he will ask for helpers to provide communication during the event.

5 Norm asked the members to make sure they have paid their dues for 2016.

6 Ed showed and discussed a Vibroplex that he restored.
