


with radios aboard ship. In addition, his military travels took him to Saudi Arabia, the Persian Gulf and Grananda, as a Chief in the United States Navy.




Our club has been getting new members lately, and it's nice to see some new faces in the crowd. Hopefully, members will have the chance to get on the WAMO Nets.




The insurance company says that sinking a vehicle in a lake by illegal use of explosives is not covered. He still had yet to make the first of those \$560 a month payments!


