After the pledge of allegiance, visitors were welcomed. This evening's speaker was the club vice-president, Dave Cyr, KG6QCO who is speaking on fire safety and prevention. After the break, the business portion of the meeting continued. SECRETARY'S Report: Was approved as published in the Counterpoise.

TREASURER: Susan Kochel, KC6WXA presented her report. It was approved as read and submitted for audit. She also mentioned that the club books are ready for the audit.

her report. It was approved as read and PRESIDENTS REPORT: Stogie, KG6JCW read the proposed amendment to the by-laws for increasing the dues. The second reading will occur in March. At that time, the amendment would be debated and voted. It takes a twothirds vote to enact the amendment. It was announced by Stogie that Sybil Albright, W6GIC became a silent key on 8 February. At the present time, funeral arrangements are pending. It was moved and seconded that the club would donate \$25 to Sybil Albright's favorite charity. The motion was carried. PAST PRESIDENT: Pat Bunsold, WA6MHZ reported that the ARES meeting will be held on this coming Saturday at Giovanni's restaurant. COUNTERPOISE Editor: Paul, KC6QLS reported on his seventh issue of the newsletter. EDUCATION: Report was given by Mike, N6OPH. The technician class is due to end in March. This class will be followed by the general license upgrade course. This class will be taught by Mike, N6OPH and only will be held on Tuesday evenings. The CW and extra theory courses will be held later in the year.

NET MANAGER: Dave, KG6QCO reported increased WAMO activity.

<u>SOCIAL CHAIRMAN:</u> Xemi, KD6PRV reports that he needs help on the field day activity. <u>PRIZE Chairman:</u> Reported a 10 transceiver, and a two meter hand held on the table for this evening's meeting.

MEMBERSHIP Chairman: Dave, KG6QCO reported 214 members and picked-up 3 new members and 3 from the technician class. The WAMO issued is 1652.

SANDARC: Report was given by Mike, N6OPH. He reported that SANDARC is considering a constitutional change for the terms of office for officers from one year to two years. SANDARC need, VE's and team leaders. SANDARC is also looking for a team leader to head the east county site in El Cajon. The convention committee seats are 60% filled. PUBLIC SERVICE: Report was given by Rich, N6NKJ. He spoke about the ARES net as well as the upcoming meeting this Saturday. Rich also spoke about the badging requirements for the ARES and county OES.

NEW BUSINESS: It was moved and seconded that the club support the changes in the SANDARC by-laws to provide for two year terms. The motion was carried.

Rich, N6NKJ reported on a possible new venue for the club meetings. The new site is the First Lutheran Church in El Cajon. The church will not charge a fee for the use of the facility. A donation at the end of the year would be optional should the club exercise that option. Mike, N6OPH stated the club needs to recognize Bob, W6RHV be for his efforts for the club. It was moved and seconded that the club move to the new location. The motion was carried. The meeting location will change in April.

Cal announced that Duncan, KF61LA will be giving his Guam lecture at the Mormon Church in La Mesa this month.

There being no further business before the general membership assembled, the meeting was adjourned at 2035hrs.




Custom Communication Solution



Something to Think About Things to have on hand

For those of you who missed last months meeting, here is the official ARES list of things you may need if you are called out to support one of the many different agencies and groups with communications. This list is from the "ARES Field Resources Manual."

1) Basic deployment equipment checklist 2-meter HT, 2-meter magmount, antenna and coax, ear-phone, paper and pencil, ARES ID card, extra batteries, appropriate clothing, and food and water.

2) For an extended 72 hour deployment, you will need; Snacks, throat lozenges, prescriptions, first aid kit, log books, 3 day change of clothes, 3 day supply of water, flashlight, with extra batteries, candles, alarm clock, electrical and duct tape, safety glasses, additional radios, batteries, and packet gear, headphones, RF connectors, extra coax, liquid refreshments, aspirin, toilet articles, message forms, shelter (tent, and sleeping bag), foul weather gear, portable stove, mess kit, with cleaning kit, batteries, water proof matches, toolbox, soldering iron, VOM, microphones, power supplies, and chargers, antennas with mounts, SWR bridge (VHF and HF) ARRL standardized connectors (Molex). I have learned that this last item is no longer considered the standardized connectors. The Anderson connectors are now the standard connectors. So now you have a list that you can add to or subtract from.
