World Amateur Day April 18



On Saturday, April 18, radio amateurs worldwide will take to the airwaves to celebrate World Amateur Radio Day (WARD) 2015. It was on April 18, 1925, that the International Amateur Radio Union (IARU) was founded in Paris, with ARRL Co-Founder Hiram Percy Maxim, 1AW, as its first president. The primary purpose of World Amateur Radio Day is to highlight Amateur Radio and its benefits to countries and communities. The IARU said World Amateur Radio Day is an opportunity for IARU member-societies to demonstrate Amateur Radio to the public and make friends with other amateurs around the world. Special event stations will be on the air over the April 18-19 weekend to highlight World Amateur Radio Day and the IARU's 90th anniversary.

Auckland Unitary Plan Update

The Submission Status

The process is underway.

On 13 March our Legal Representative, Julie Goodyer of Ellis Gould, with Peter Loveridge ZL2UKG and Douglas Birt ZL1BFS, attended the pre-hearing meeting of the Independent Hearings Panel (IHP).

The issue of "Definitions" had been scheduled for being heard some months later than our submission hearings, and as definitions of such things as masts, Antennas versus Aerials, height in relation to boundary, etc. were critical to our case, we wanted the definitions section to be brought forward. This was not adopted by the IHP, but they assured us that anything we represented as part of our case would be carried into the later "Definitions" determinations.

The really dominant submitter at the pre-hearing was the Auckland Utilities Operations Group (AUOG - which represented all the major utility companies such as power companies and telecommunications companies) contacted Julie and indicated to her that it was happy to work in with NZART, so that appears to be a benefit we had not expected.

Our Opposers

It is noted that K Vernon, who put in a Further Submission opposing everything NZART had submitted, confirmed his opposition to all points.

The Jock White National Field Day has come and gone. This year we did not compete for the Montgomery Cup, rather we entered the Phone section only because our Top gun CW operators were not available. Gwynne, ZL1AAR took charge on the day, assisted by Japie, ZL1JJN, Ray, ZL1AJR, Logan, ZL1LMN, and some soon to be new Members.

I have to acknowledge the generosity of Mrs. Carolyn Nicoll who donated a new tent. Remember the stormy day last year when we were very nearly blown away and one tent was torn to tatters. Carolyn and Christine kept everyone well fed . Altogether, the day was very relaxed and the participants enjoyed the contest.



Last month, the annual inter-branch ARDF (Fox hunt) competition was convened in the vicinity of our clubroom where both 2m and 80m transmitters were located in the pony club's paddocks. The event was won by Harry Pompe ZL1BK, representing the Auckland VHF Group. Harry won the event last October when we were at Cornwall Park. Our thanks go to Harry for going out again to collect the transmitters while Wallace had been called away to his wife's side – just out of hospital.

This event clashed with the St Heliers Sandcastle day, where last year Wallace used his catapult to secure a halyard over a street lamp from which to suspend a vertical delta 40m loop. It was so successful working the northern hemisphere (which is perpendicular to the plane of the loop). I wonder if you heard the story about Ray's contact with a Japanese Ham. A person who just happened to be passing by, recognised the voice on the radio. So Ray handed him the microphone so that they could converse (in Japanese). How rare is such a chance encounter !

World Amateur day is on 18th April this year; so we intend to set up a station in Mission Bay to demonstrate our hobby to any passers' by. Please find us near the sea wall, to assist with crowd control. Hi, Hi. Later in the year we might return there for Lighthouse week-end when Operators will be asked to assist.

The Remotely controlled station has passed its experimental phase. This means that Wallace will accept applications from financial Members who wish to be registered and put on the database allowing transmission privileges. Only 80m and 40m bands may be used just yet. You just need to download RCForb from **www.RemoteHams.com** and scroll down the list of available remote stations until you find ZL1AA. In the interests of simplicity, not all the K3's buttons have been made available. However its sensitivity is preserved, and subject to band conditions, DX can be heard day and night.

Your committee has hammered out a policy for sharing its use. In brief: users are expected to adopt a courtesy system (via the memo window) to book times in half hour spells; use own call-sign suffixed by "Remote" and observe the Amateur Code of Conduct. Nevertheless, a pack of operating tips and information will be sent to registered users. We expect that this service will be used by those whose city real estate makes it impractical for them to erect an efficient antenna or those whose neighbour has a plasma TV. Hitherto, this remotely controlled station has been used to listen to our Thursday net on 3.645 MHz at 2000 hours and this will continue as a fixed booking. Anyone can listen in but only registered Members can tune the radio.

NCDXF Announces Major Grant To VKØEK Heard Island DXpedition

The Northern California DX Foundation is pleased to announce a grant of \$50,000 to the VK0EK Heard Island DXpedition planned for November 2015. Heard Island has moved up to the #5 position on the ClubLog Most Wanted List, after the recent Navassa operation.

Without major financial support from NCDXF, DXpeditions like this to challenging or rare locations would not be possible.

Within the last year, NCDXF has given \$175,000 in grants to operations in Iran, Andaman, Navassa, Eritrea, South Sandwich, South Georgia, Chesterfield, Heard and to a yet unannounced DXpedition, all of which are in or near the Top Ten Most Wanted.

We have been doing this for the past 42 years, making rare DX happen and bringing fun to DXers everywhere. The credit for these large grants goes to the NCDXF contributors, individuals and clubs, who believe in supporting NCDXF.

World Amateur Radio Day

Every April 18, radio amateurs worldwide take to the airwaves in celebration of World Amateur Radio Day. It was on that day in 1925 that the International Amateur Radio Union was formed in Paris.

Amateur Radio experimenters were the first to discover that the short wave spectrum — far from being a wasteland — could support worldwide propagation. In the rush to use these shorter wavelengths, Amateur Radio was "in grave danger of being pushed aside," the IARU's history has noted. Amateur Radio pioneers met in Paris in 1925 and created the IARU to support Amateur Radio worldwide.

Just two years later, at the International Radiotelegraph Conference, Amateur Radio gained the allocations still recognized today — 160, 80, 40, 20, and 10 meters. Since its founding, the IARU has worked tirelessly to defend and expand the frequency allocations for Amateur Radio. Thanks to the support of enlightened administrations in every part of the globe, radio amateurs are now able to experiment and communicate in frequency bands strategically located throughout the radio spectrum. From the 25 countries that formed the IARU in 1925, the IARU has grown to include 160 member-societies in three regions. IARU Region 1 includes Europe, Africa, the Middle East, and Northern Asia. Region 2 covers the Americas, and Region 3 is comprised of Australia, New Zealand, the Pacific island nations, and most of Asia. The International Telecommunication Union (ITU) has recognized the IARU as representing the interests of Amateur Radio.

Today, Amateur Radio is more popular than ever, with over 3,000,000 licensed operators!

World Amateur Radio Day is the day when IARU Member-Societies can show our capabilities to the public and enjoy global friendship with other Amateurs worldwide.
