### From your President, George ZL1TUJ

#### The new tower:



On the front page of last month's newsletter was an artist's impression of what he tower may look like. We are thankful to Selwyn, ZL1BRC, our legal watchdog, for pointing out the necessary steps that must be taken before erecting it. Auckland Council have no objection to us putting it on the site of the original Civil Defense building that was set ablaze in 1981 and subsequently demolished. That patch of ground has been an eyesore ever since. We intend to clean it up the area. After that we shall pour the concrete footing for the tower's pedestal — a 4 metre high shaft on which the tower tilts. It is important that the tower is erected before the Auckland Unitary Plan comes into effect in September.

#### **Memorial Contest:**

This is a favourite annual contest for most New Zealanders. Some Members have already put up their hands at the last General Meeting to say that they will be entering the contest.

The Committee is mindful that we do very little to attract our newer Members to meet convivially at the clubroom. This Contest provides an opportunity to open the clubroom and put ZL1AA on the air. I will not trust the DX cluster and will be sure of the DX station's call sign before calling.

I will not interfere with the DX station nor anyone calling and will never tune up on the DX frequency or in the QSX slot.

I will wait for the DX station to end a contact before I call.

I will always send my full call sign.

I will call and then listen for a reasonable interval. I will not call continuously.

I will not transmit when the DX operator calls another call sign, not mine.

I will not transmit when the DX operator queries a call sign not like mine.

I will not transmit when the DX station requests geographic areas other than mine.

When the DX operator calls me, I will not repeat my call sign unless I think he has copied it incorrectly.

I will be thankful if and when I do make a contact.

I will respect my fellow hams and conduct myself so as to earn their respect.

- A plaque should be made to attach to the tower.
- Auckland Council Property Management Division have no objection. However this is not a regulatory consent.

- Antenna to use: Not decided
- Additional components: Not considered.
- Users of it: Not decided yet. Interim use will be to make comparisons with our other antennas.
- No urgency is given to this project, other than to take earlier advice given by Vaughan to "erect antennas before the Unitary Plan is finalised.

#### **Memorial Day contest**

- While at the NZART Conference, Gwynne took the initiative to order and buy this sign / flag that announces "Branch 02, Auckland" above the NZART logo. It is supported by a 2 m pole and is self standing. It fits into a roll-up pouch that is 1 metre long and therefore very portable.
- This is intended to be used at various outings: Amateur day, Village festival or wherever we have a presence. Its use will possibly avoid having to unscrew our cumbersome gate sign.
- A vote of thanks was given to Gwynne and resolution to reimburse him \$199.00.

#### Computers:

- The other black PC with Vista next to Station 1 is networked. This means that it has access to all other computer's files, the internet and the 3 in 1 colour printer.

- The white PC behind the door has too little memory and no USB ports to be very useful. The exam material stored in it is now out of date. It has a local printer.

## NZART Memorial Contest Rules Updated on: 8 May 2013

To commemorate those New Zealand amateur radio operators who lost their lives in World War 2.

**1. When:** Weekend 6/7 July 2013; 2000 – 2300 NZST; Three one-hourly operating periods each evening.

#### 2. Band: 80m only

A station may be contacted twice during each operating period – once on SSB and once on CW, <u>provided</u> that contacts are not consecutive.

#### 3. Operator Category or Sections:

- Mixed mode SSB and CW
- CW only
- SSB only
- QRP

Non-ZL - Australian and other South Pacific stations

#### 4. Exchange:

RS(T) report plus a three digit serial number starting at 001 for the first contact and incrementing by one for each subsequent contact.

#### 5. Scoring:

#### A. Contact points:

SSB - One point per contact

CW - Two points per contact

#### **B.** Multipliers:

Each different ZL, VK or South Pacific callsign prefix worked on SSB and CW is a multiplier. (eg. a VK7 worked on both SSB & CW counts as two multipliers).

#### C. Scoring:

The final score is the sum of the contact points multiplied by the number of different multiplier worked.


#### 6. Logs:

Sample log sheets can be downloaded from NZART web site. Contacts should be listed in time order.

#### 7. Summary Sheet:

A sample summary sheet, also available from the NZART web site, must be completed and attached to the log sheets and should show the following information:

- A. Callsign
- B. Name and full address of operator.
- C. Operator Category (see rule 3)
- D. Brief description of equipment used and power output.
- E. Points Summary



#### 8. Log Submissions:

By email: to <a href="mailto:2bfrank@orcon.net.nz">2bfrank@orcon.net.nz</a>. Logs and summary sheets should be sent as attachments and can be in plain text, MSWord or Excel formats.

Paper logs and summary sheets should be sent to NZART Contest Manager, Frank Hunt, ZL2BR, 8 Manu Crescent, New Plymouth 4310.

Logs should arrive no later than four weeks after the contest date.
