JWFD report:

Preparations were completed in time to enable the stations to be on the air by 1500 hours.

Japie's was thanked for his exceptional efforts.

By the end of the contest, our serial numbers were ahead of other competitors on both 40m and 80m CW and SSB.

However, it was discovered that a bug in the NIMM log program did not advance the exchange serial number consistently.

Wes has completed the logs, ready for dispatch to Stuart Watchman.

A more detailed report will follow after the results are announced.

Antennas / Project plans:

Base of tri-band tower needs re-affixing – ideal weather just now.

A smaller base plate is preferable. 24 mm holes should be drilled in the concrete to ensure that the Chemset 101 [™] makes contact with the threaded bolts. The guy ropes should also be replaced.

Antenna(s) for Yaesu FT736R at HF3 - 6 m dipole, or extend the quad or put Yagi and rotator on Nally tower?

There is enough cable for another run though conduit for a 6m Yagi

Tower at Murrays Bay is ready to be taken down; then transported later. Steve and Japie have agreed to this.

George Irving ZL1IV's vertical antenna has been removed.

We shall offer to demount the Yagi at Ray Chapman's house, subject to consent by his brother / solicitor.



Auckland Branch 02, NZART (Inc.) Minutes of February General Meeting

Date / Time / Place: Saturday 17th February 2018 at 1355 hours / Clubroom

Sustained ZL1WAL / ZL1AJR

Minutes: Minutes of General Meeting on Saturday 18th November 2017 was summarized and read out.

Adopted ZL1WAL / ZL1AJR

Matters arising:

Calling of General Meetings: The Committee has agreed with the recommendation made by resolution at the November General Meeting "that in respect of general meetings, the status quo of the Constitution should be kept". It is deemed undesirable to make the constitution more prescriptive than it is already. The Committee is pleased that NZART President, Stuart Watchman, supports our President's emphasis on holding meetings about the hobby, rather than to conduct business, per se, the prerogative of the Committee. Whereas clause 9.c) allows General Meetings to be dispensed with, it was noted that General Meetings in April and August 2017 were replaced by "Working Bees", and announced as such. Therefore, no defect in their calling ever occurred.

Reports from the Committee of its meeting on 6th February 2018, the minutes of which is in the Feb newsletter. **Ownership of the clubhouse building:** Wallace has spoken to Charly Baik, the successor to Richard Ward as Property Manager for Panuku Developments, following up his letter asking for confirmation that our clubhouse is **not** on ACPL's asset register. This is required to satisfy Insurance legalities.

Overseas listeners: NZART Council has approved the amendment to the Constitution that we made at the AGM in December 2017 to allow another class of membership for overseas listeners to tune the Remote Station. This amendment has been sent to the Registrar of Incorporated Societies.

Newsletters are accessible on our web site immediately they are distributed to Members.

Invoices are being sent to collect subs in arrears. Provisions of the Membership clause of the constitution stipulates that defaulters of the Branch lose privileges and defaulters of NZART may be purged from the Membership Register. There are 34 NZART Members attached to Auckland Branch that have not joined it.

Additional base plate for the tri-band tower: A template will be used to drilling the holes in it. Quotes have been received to make it for \$500 and \$650 both of which are considered to be too expensive. Meanwhile Japie is hopeful of sourcing scrap metal.

Lawns: In recent months, three Committee Members have taken turns to mow them. Steve ZL1FS reported an arrangement that he has made with the Meadowbank Pony Club for their grounds-man to cut them using their tractor and mower. The Pony Club has problems with staffing this function for their ride-on mower.

Timber: Wallace confirmed that timber stacked beside the implement shed, is within the NE corner area defined by our Licence to Occupy. City Rail Link, the new leasee, has arranged that Auckland Transport will remove it. It is understood that the whole yard will be cleared for CRL's exclusive use for the next three years.

PREPARTION FOR JWFD CONTEST:

Whereas the newsletter announced that today's meeting was for "JWFD PLANNING AND PREP", Wes declared that it was disappointing that so few Members showed up. Nor had Wes heard from any volunteers except Andrei (who has committed to come from Sydney). As devil's advocate, he posed the question of abandoning our participation in JWFD this year because the work /effort was unfair on the willing few. It was noted that other Branches have reduced their operation to one band and /or one mode. For lack of volunteers, we too have To consider this option.

The main objective of Jock White Field Day is to demonstrate our AREC readiness to operate without phone and electricity, as might occur in a national /local disaster. Striving to win a contest (in various categories) is merely an incentive to improve our effectiveness. Wes said that he is passionate about winning the Montgomery Cup (back from ZL1AM Whangarei, winner in 2017).

Suggestions made:

The attendees at the meeting reject the idea of abandoning or reducing the scope of our participation. The OM of the club (who are seen sometimes only once per year), could be encouraged to operate. Students could be invited to operate under their supervision. It is also an opportunity to recruit them. Wes intends to compose a schedule of tasks to be e-mailed to every Member, asking them to fill in the times that they are available to operate, help set-up tents, antennas, etc. and pack-up afterwards. The phone tree (8 Members allocated to each Committee Member) could be used to follow up.

TE PUKE SALE:

The table is groaning with boxes of junk, some having been stored on our shelves for years. Wes will take this to Te Puke on 3rd March to dispose of it. Members should look it over beforehand.

Raymond Chapman ZL1AJR – silent key

Paraphrased from the eulogies delivered at his funeral

Amateurs know Ray better as "Zulu Lima One, Alpha Juliet Romeo" (in international speak). We recognize each other by our call-signs before exchanging Christian names. Ray was born a Londoner, living in West Kensington, son of a professional chauffeur to various aristocrats. His father drove ambulances when the Battle of Britain was fought over London and he was subsequently decorated for his services. For example he would lead convoys to / from the ports which were being bombed and were on fire. Ray was a teenager then. His first job was delivering telegrams until he qualified as a PMG Technician; and from the knowledge gained, he built his first TV, albeit the image was upside down when first tested.

Ray spent his two year military service at a Royal Air Force base in Pakistan as a CW operator. He said that they used **not** to write down each message until after it had finished which caused their Commanding Officer to reprimand them, insisting that each message should be written as it was being received. In this cold-war period, they sometimes heard Russian operators doubling with them; so had to be politely asked to QSY.

He was miffed that the Pakistan Government took his money when he applied to sit the Radio Amateur's licence examination, only to be denied being given a call-sign because he was not a national. Ray eventually obtained his Licence when he joined Auckland Branch in 1952 after his family had emigrated here by ship. This might explain Ray's pleasure in cruising. For he had made over 70 cruises with the P&O line around the Pacific Ocean after visiting his younger brother each Christmas time in Sydney. He dined at the Captain's table and reveled in the privileges afforded to a diamond pin wearing frequent traveler.

Ray loved his radios; sparing no expense to own the latest model. Only last month he modestly bought an unopened carton into the clubroom to show us his latest purchase - an ICom 7610. Earlier models, he would lend to newer Members of the club, so as to get them started – and that included me. Ray was curious to learn how things ticked. Thus he acquired encyclopedic knowledge that he willingly shared with others.

Ray was overwhelmingly generous towards the club, handing down his microwave oven, vacuum cleaner, kettle and other appliances after upgrading these in his own house. He provisioned us with tea, coffee, milk and cakes each Saturday that we regularly meet. Whoever succeeds him has a hard act to follow.

Ray was an enthusiast in every activity that we engaged in. Our newsletters are peppered with pictures of him at every public event that we have attended. For example, when St Heliers holds its annual "village day", we would set up station ZL1AA and operate from it so as to publicize our hobby. Ray was so friendly to passers-by who were curious about what we were doing. His favourite story is as follows: Near the beach on "sand-castle day", we had lassoed the top of two street lights, and suspended an inverted vertical delta loop between them. Thus, propagation to the north was excellent. When a passer-by recognized the voice of Ray's contact, Ray handed the microphone to him, and witnessed them conversing in Japanese. And, in cooperation with the local orienteering club in various parks around the city, he would pick me up and help organize a fox (transmitter) hunt where the participants use directional finding radios. Any visitors to our clubroom were latched onto by Ray and befriended. Lately, frailty had slowed him down, but his presence at working bees, passing tools, was encouragement enough for the real workers. As a mentor and for such dependable service, he was made a Life Member.

Strangely, Ray did **not** persevere with CW. He was in awe of one of our operators whom he witnessed handling a pile up. Andrei ZL1TM was this operator who decoded and memorized four call signs all at once. Ray preferred to operate SSB. How mortified he was, when last year, he lost his voice completely within a few minutes of the start of the JWFD contest. Above all, Ray was a contributor. Last week we finished our Committee meeting 40 minutes earlier than usual. Our Chairman was heard to say: *"I wonder why"*. Ray is already missed.


