New Nepal Earthquake May 12

Amateur radio emergency nets are reported to have been activated on 14205 kHz and 14215 kHz

The following direct from Kathmandu Tuesday morning from Satish, 9N1AA:

"The network is congested. Phone is not working well. Internet is barely functional. Yes it was very terrifying but people were much better prepared this time. Electricity has been shut off. There were some reports of fire in the city. The airport seems to have been closed for the time being till assessment. Schools were scheduled to reopen tomorrow but it's highly unlikely that it'll happen. Life had slowly returned back to normalcy but no more. The latest earthquake will definitely make it hard for people to move on with their daily lives. Some casualties were reported from the eastern part of the country, we are still awaiting detailed reports. Rain and landslide has been forecast for the coming days which might affect the rescue and relief operations. Satish Kharel, 9N1AA"

Auckland Unitary Plan Update

The Submission Status

The process is underway.

On 13 March our Legal Representative, Julie Goodyer of Ellis Gould, with Peter Loveridge ZL2UKG and Douglas Birt ZL1BFS, attended the pre-hearing meeting of the Independent Hearings Panel (IHP).

The issue of "Definitions" had been scheduled for being heard some months later than our submission hearings, and as definitions of such things as masts, Antennas versus Aerials, height in relation to boundary, etc. were critical to our case, we wanted the definitions section to be brought forward. This was not adopted by the IHP, but they assured us that anything we represented as part of our case would be carried into the later "Definitions" determinations.

The really dominant submitter at the pre-hearing was the Auckland Utilities Operations Group (AUOG - which represented all the major utility companies such as power companies and telecommunications companies) contacted Julie and indicated to her that it was happy to work in with NZART, so that appears to be a benefit we had not expected.

Our Opposers

It is noted that K Vernon, who put in a Further Submission opposing everything NZART had submitted, confirmed his opposition to all points.

It is also noted that Hartwig Clasen who put in an original submission supporting the Restricted Discretionary clauses in the Notified Plan, advised that he would like the points 5219-26 and 5219-27 changed from "mediation" "consider". This was adopted by the IHP, but is of little interest to us, as only concerns wind-power installations.

VK0EK SIGNS CONTRACT FOR THE VESSEL

Voyage Rescheduled for March 6-April 20, 2016




Wednesday, 13 May 2015. Today Cordell Expeditions signed a contract with Tauranga based Nigel Jolly, owner and operator of the Braveheart (above), for the expedition to Heard Island, and moved the project schedule to March-April, 2016. The ship will depart from Cape Town, South Africa, proceed directly to Heard Island, and finally to Fremantle, Australia. The stay at Heard Island will be nominally March 16 – April 8, 2016.

The nominal 21-day stay at Heard Island will enable amateur radio operations, using the call sign VKØEK. While the radio operation is the primary goal, the team will also carry out a limited scientific program, including a search for new species that can enhance our understanding of biodiviersity and the effects of climate change.

The new contract resulted from the inability of Heritage Expeditions to deliver on its promise of providing a safe and supported operation at Heard Island using the Russian vessel Akad. Shokalskiy. Obviously, the conversion to the new vessel and schedule will require adapting the team and the project activities, but the major goals of the expedition remain unchanged. We are grateful to the Northern California DX Foundation and numerous other organizations, and many, many individuals for their generous support of this project.

Opportunity for Rideshare to Geostationary Orbit

AMSAT is excited to announce that we have accepted an opportunity to participate in a potential rideshare as a hosted payload on a geostationary satellite planned for launch in 2017. An amateur radio payload, operating in the Amateur Satellite Service, will fly on a spacecraft which Millennium Space Systems (MSS) of El Segundo, CA is contracted to design, launch, and operate for the US government based on their Aquila M8 Series Satellite Structure.

ZL1WAL STEALTH ANTENNA

Specifications:

- The mast comprises 8 metres of scaffolding (in three sections) of which 6m exits from a
 disused flue that descends to the basement of the house.
- The mast weighs 40 kg; the galvanized poles are 48mm OD; walls are 4mm; flanges are 125mm OD spaced 500 mm.
- A boat trailer winch is mounted near the top of the flue; its wire goes down the inside of the flue, around a large pulley at the bottom of the mast and back up to the top of the flue.
- The top of the mast has five rope guys. (Should any one guy fail, the mast will remain upright, allowing time to repair it.)
- A KR400 rotator and K4KIO Hex beam will be mounted at the top. These weigh 20 Kg together.
- 6 bands: 20m, 17m, 15m, 12m, 10m, 6m.
