Reports:

- Douglas Birt ZL1BFS continues to meet with other Branches to discuss a unified submission to the Auckland City Unitary Plan. We were the first Branch last month.
- ARDF activity at JOTA at Camp Maynard on 19-20 October was described by Wallace ZL1WAL
 who set up three 80m foxes and five 2m foxes. There was little participation. On Sunday Steve
 ZL1FS helped some youngsters around the course and he brought the 80m gear back.
- Erection of the Nally fold-over crank-up tower (ex Estate of John Nixon ZL1FR) is being planned.
- ZL1AA is just one of 50 stations world-wide on the RCForb site. Individual registration with the host is required by Amateurs wishing to tune the radio. The banner page invites listeners to join our Branch. Already some applications have been received from overseas Hams. On Monday night, the station is tuned to 3.645 MHz, so that our Members, who have poor reception at their QTH, can be passive listeners. They transmit from their own rigs.
- JWFD: The idea of fielding a B team for the sake of newer Members, and the practical difficult ties of avoiding interference with the A team, was discussed.

This part of the meeting concluded at 1350 hours.

Presentations:

- Selwyn Ross ZL1BRC lectured about the necessity to keep ZL1AA on the air. He explained recent solar activity showing printed examples of web pages that report trends and predictions about conditions in the F layers of the ionosphere. He stressed the variability that might prevail to give openings for DX transmission.
- Simon Watt-Wyness ZLSWW followed with a professionally prepared power-point presentation that confined itself to VHF and UHF transmission conditions, especially in sporadic E layers. He stressed that a lot of listening was required to fluke these opportunities that lasted such a short time.

The Meeting concluded at 1512 hours.

General Business:

- **Painting:** Wallace was thanked for painting the east wall. Gwynne had water blasted it and Steve had assembled the scaffolding.
- **The Tower:** Pending getting an Engineer's recommendation, Steve ZL1FS outlined a plan to drill the existing concrete slab and affix long threaded studs with epoxy glue before bolting down the base plate of the pedestal. Meanwhile the tower should be guyed until a further layer of concrete is poured over the existing slab. Jason Harvey ZL2UJI will be asked to weld the mesh / reinforcing rods. The deadline is February 2014.
- **Loop antenna:** A recommendation was made to buy UV resistance guy ropes for the bamboo poles to support the Loop antenna. The maximum practical height is 8.5 metres. Such supports are needed before JWFD.
- **JWFD:** There is an alternative antenna cut, tested and ready to be used on JWFD.
- **Fox hunting equipment:** Ray ZI1AJR was thanked for his donation of a further 4 head-phones to be used instead of ear pieces for the sniffer receivers.

The meeting ended at 21:22 hours with supper provided by the Committee.

President's Report for 2013

This year presented some challenges for the club.. We have had several functions that proved to be unsuccessful. The turnout was very low with some of them. The fox hunts were a mixed bag with the equipment not very reliable. We will import some 80 meter kit sets in the new year to help build up the numbers. The remote station has finally been set up in listening mode. I intend to provide the people on the remote list with a copy each of the K3 Operation Manual.

We have now made provision to set up a base so that the new tower will have a place to be mounted. This must be done before the end of January. We have an antenna donated to put on it.

We will need to submit a small request for funds to lotto before New Year.

Most of the maintenance has been completed with some still in progress. Hopefully the weather will cooperate.

This coming year we need to be more honest about putting money in the supper tin.

We need to get written approval to allow the remote station to be operated by overseas Hams. This must cover the Trustees so that they are not put in a position of uncertainty. The remote station has the potential to provide a listening post for overseas hams and a good source of funds for the club. Transmitting will require more thorough vetting as to call signs being officially vetted by the countries official issuing authority. This is work in progress and will require some patience.

FINANCIAL REPORT FOR 2013

These accounts have been audited. I move a vote of thanks to Mrs Christine Watson, our Honorary Auditor.

At last year's AGM we circulated the Budget that the Incoming Committee accepted. It showed a deficit:		
The following are the variances from the Budget that occurred during this year: 1 Increased Members' subscriptions 2 Increased Members' donations 3 Additional component sales 4 Commission earned 5 Building maintenance deferred 6 Interest on our Term Investment that was reinvested, rather than paid into our cheque account 7 Other unremarkable variances	\$455 \$360 \$224 \$175 \$829 -\$237 -\$192	
Thus it would appear that we were on track to end up with a tiny surplus.		
However, two exceptional events occurred during the year, to which the Committee responded. They were: 1 A pledge was made towards the Fighting Fund against Auckland Council's Unitary Plan: This amount has not been paid out yet, but it is included in these accounts and appears as a liability in the Balance Sheet. It was pleasing to find that some Members contributed privately to match this amount.	-\$800	
Our Member, the late John Nixon ZL1FR-SK, finally passed away. His last contact was with Gwynne who visited his Dairy Flat property, the site of his Nally fold-over crank-up tower. We purchased his Kenwood TS480HX 200 watt transceiver from his trust:	-\$1,300	
This purchase enabled us to successfully tender for this tower that his Solicitors recognised would go to the good of the greatest number - consistent with John's wishes. The cost to remove it and to transport it back to Auckland amounted to:	-\$200 -\$388	
·		
Taking this all into account, we exceeded the original budget by \$1,000 and ended up with a deficit of:	-\$2,674	
The budget for 2014 has been scrutinised and will be recommended to the incomming Committee. It aims to be in deficit by \$1,000. We purposely never include windfall expectations from the proceeds of possible deceased estates that have kept us solvent in previous years. Nor have we applied for grants.		
Membership has remained static at 42. NZART has "attached" 69 Amateur's names, 12 more than last year. There is some overlap of these numbers; 27 of our Members are attached to our Branch and 25 are not, which means that the latter do not count when we vote on remits or other NZART AGM business. Each year I write to every one of these attached people to seek their votes about remits and either invite them to join this Branch, or prompt them to ask to be attached to a more convenient Branch. Only 2 or 3 respond which nets us \$100.	\$100	
Collecting Members' subscription is an arduous task. Seven Members have not renewed this year worth		
Gwynne's inititiative to provide and raffle the latest ARRLHandbook proved to be an incentive to collect Members subscription early in the financial year. We should do it again, that is, charge the same subscription, i.e. and offer a raffle ticket worth \$5,00 as an incentive to pay by 31 March 2014.	\$45	

A tax return was filed with Inland Revenue to recover Withholding tax deducted for interest earned. Our Exempt status is recorded against the present Term Investment with Kiwi Bank which matures in February. The Annual return to The Companies Office is made immediately after this meeting. T'was the night before Christmas, And all through two-meters, Not a signal was keying up Any repeaters.
