Each radio operator's car requires two people so even if you don't have the ability to set up a mobile HF station there is possibly a place for you to help.

This year the rally route is as follows: Friday 11 April – 5 stages east of Paparoa Service Park – run twice. Saturday 12 April – four stages west of Paparoa S/P – Manukau SSS. Sunday 13 April – Te Akau South then Te Akau North – Maramarua Forest.

MUSICK POINT

On 12th January 2003 the rededication of the Musick Point Radio Station and Open Day was held. This was a most successful occasion with a plaque being unveiled by the American Ambassador, Charles Swindells, to commemorate Captain Musick and the Coastal Radio Station that operated from the site for many years. All the radio clubs of Auckland set up displays on the various radio activities that radio clubs are involved in. Branch 03 erected the club's tents and set up a display of vintage, military and domestic radio equipment. The day was used to show Amateur Radio to the public and in this respect it was most successful with between 1000 and 1500 people attending to witness the rededication and to view the various displays. Field Day 22/23rd February

A Site has been found at the Crawl Homestead, Anawhata Road to be used by our club for the Jock White Memorial Contest this year. Club stations from all around New Zealand will be competing in the contest. The aim of the field day contest is to demonstrate to the rest of New Zealand the radio amateurs' ability and preparedness to set up a field station and operate for an extended period free from mains power; and of course, to have a bit of fun. We need operators for both CW and Phone. The field day contest runs from Saturday 1500 hrs to midnight, then from 0600 to 1500 on Sunday. If you can help out for short or longer periods of time you would be most welcome. CW operators are most welcome. The power source will be from the club's new 4.1 kVA generator. During the February club meeting the details of the station or stations will be finalised.

Woodhill Horse Endurance Event on Saturday/Sunday 25/26th January

This really started many days before the event with checks and organising operators to assist with the programme. This was done with the help of other Clubs under the leadership of Brian ZL1MW for WSRC and Bob ZL1BBZ for Franklin Club. Up to fifteen operators were needed for the two days of activity. Only in the last few days did Brian know where the checkpoints were to be placed in the forest and surrounding area. A schedule had to be produced and two shifts were required on Saturday because of the early morning start of 02:30am. The first shift was from 02:30am to 07:00am then the day shift from 07:00am to 17:00pm and latter for those back at base. Base was under canvas in a large Marquee. With no power, batteries were needed to power the radios, the PA system and lights. A special stand was erected to support the check board and associated paper work used to track the progress of the riders. On Saturday the riders had a number of options and could enter the 140km, 60km, 30km, and 40km Competition Rides, depending on his or her ability.

A start /finish operator was in place to check out the horses and check them back in. There were five operators set up in cars keeping a check on the rider's numbers as they passed by. This information, and time, was radioed to base so progress could be monitored for the whole distance to ensure that horses were not being overstressed. A speed average was worked out and the riders had to work to it or be penalised.

The day remained mostly fine, with a just a few showers that made it more humid. I took one of the club's tents and set up by the end of the track on some nice ground. We set up the rig from the car on a box table using extension power leads and coaxial cable to the vertical whip on the car. This worked well, apart from when I turned off the rig to remove it from the car and then reconnected, there was no display. It appeared that there was a thermal shut down and this would not allow the rig to start again till a period of time had elapsed, in this case one hour. In the mean time I could copy the other stations on my handheld but could not make contact with base or Ian who was some 3.5 km down the road at another checkpoint. Nothing could be done but wait with horses due soon. Bob came to the rescue with another rig and power supply. He thought it might have been a voltage drop with the extension power lead from the car. We were back in contact with the world, base and the other checkpoints on the battery that Bob installed.

Things worked out well for the rest of the day. We stayed in place over night, had tea, watched the news on TV, and then went to bed. Next morning we were up early, had breakfast waited for the first riders due shortly after the 05:00am start.

On the second day the events were the 100km Open Junior, Mass start of 100km, 80km Junior and to finish off with a 40km-training ride. The fields seemed to be bigger than the previous day, so we were all kept on our toes. There was not much road traffic as no tree-cutting was taking place in the area and the forestry had locked many of the gates. This meant that operators trying to get to check points had to use various other routes, but all managed to get in before the action began. Radio communications were good, though in some places if you moved more than a few feet forward or back signal strength dropped. On Saturday we made 53 reports to base and Sunday 44.

A tiring weekend but luckily Monday was Anniversary Day so we were able to catch up on some wellneeded rest.
