The talk is being given by Mr Geoffrey Durrant, a Broadcast Engineer who imports the equipment and is very familiar with the technology. He has already demonstrated the equipment to commercial broadcasters in New Zealand, which provides a favourable option for NZ Broadcasters as against other systems that are currently available.
