New Zealand Rally of Whangarei 12th / 13th May 2007

A week before the Rally start we were given the maps and route instruction for the stages we had to do radio com's as 5km operators. We planned what time it would take to get to the stages, and where we would stay for the two nights while up north. As we had Wairere 1 and 2 on Saturday, and Sunday we had Brooks 1 and 2. So we arranged a site at Paparoa camping ground to stay over and be close to both our stages.

With a 7 am on site time for the first stage of the day, we left the camp ground in the dark and slight rain falling as we made our way to our position at point B, which we found quite easily. Once in position we commenced to set up with safety signs, antenna mast up so we could raise the dipole and tune up to get in touch with control. This was done before the safety car came through to check we were in the correct location and behind the tape that was left on site. We logged through the safety cars ready for the start and the first cars passed. Green was on time. Com's were good copy with all stations round the course. We only had one close mishap as a car came up the hill to our position, over-cooked and nearly spun into a drain on the side of the road. He was able to back up and proceed to the finish, with only his pride hurt. But this did mean that the road could have been blocked if only temporary. The FIV team went to help, but were not required.

During our break for lunch, between stages on SS12 one of the cars left the road and rolled, causing some concern and the SOS sign was shown to proceeding drivers causing the stage to be yellowed flagged for the rest of the cars in the stage. This allowed all the remaining cars to travel the stage, and an average time was given them. The alternative would have been to reissue new route instructions to get the cars back to service park before the start of the afternoon sections, a re-run of the mornings runs

The weekend proved to be well run with the overall winner being a local New Zealand driver who has only been rallying in this class for only a short time. Cody Crocker, with Ben Atkinson as co-driver. but he was down on time by 28 seconds. Then there was a Kiwi class also.

After the rally finished we packed up and made our way to the main road. You could see how close the rally cars had run to the side of the road. Once we hit the main road we joined the queue and travelled at a leisurely pace Till next time

Laminated Certificates for 1st, 2nd and 3rd, in both Phone and CW. Also 1st VK or 1st ZL (if not the Trophy winner).

ZL's came 1st and 4th in the 80M Phone, - so, get some wire up in the air, and give 160M a go. (maybe do as I do, - just use RCA plugs to attach 20m tails to your 80M dipole, running in any direction, and connect via an ATU).

These Contests are for your enjoyment, but they can only continue if the number of Logs returned makes it viable. This also applies to individual Categories (like CW), which will only survive if the participation warrants it. We need as many ZL prefixes taking part as possible (particularly the elusive ZL3's) - a ZL6 would be a big help too!
