

The next Club Night will be on Monday 8<sup>th</sup> October at 7:30 pm. The topic is yet to be advised.


# **September Meeting**

At the September meeting we had a talk by Andrew ZL2ALW on GPS, how it works, the NMEA 0183 protocols, and how to make sense of the data produced by the GPS receiving apparatus as it is transferred to a computer or other device. Andrew then went on to describe how to set up a mobile station using an GPS receiver through to a small device to convert the data to a sound that could be transmitted on 2 metres (144.575 MHz) to be received by a network of stations, including our own Digined beacon, so that the path of the vehicle could be tracked. This data is also relayed to the website <a href="http://aprs.he.fi/">http://aprs.he.fi/</a>. This interesting site has a wealth of information on it, on mobile and fixed APRS stations. Weather conditions at weather stations can be viewed or GPS equipped vehicles can be tracked. To log on just type in your Callsign and after a few seconds you will get a screen that looks something like this:



You can adjust the scale and the location by using the sliding scale to the left of the screen to your hearts content as indicated below:



This programme has links to Google Earth and by clicking on the Satellite button towards the top right you can bring up an aerial photo of the area. Right clicking on the Station Icon will bring up information on that station and if it is a weather station, all the data such as rainfall, temperature, humidity will be displayed as shown below.

### A Field Trip to W6AM in 1986

The W6AM station was legendary both on the West Coast and East Coast of the USA, and all points between. Probably all points period. Don could smoke you in a pileup for some obscure African station no matter what band and even if you were on the east coast and him in Southern California.

Don was #1 on ARRL's DXCC Honour Roll, and you didn't argue. No matter where you were, no matter what you were running, Don had beaten you in a pileup. More than once. One summer afternoon in 1986, a bunch of us in the Southern California Contest Club were just wrapping up a club meeting at our usual spot in a pizza parlour. Jim Neiger N6TJ invited us to follow him to Don's place for an impromptu tour. Don passed away the previous summer (1985) and Jim was the caretaker of the place at the time. A few had other obligations but the rest of us asked, "are you kidding?!" And off we went, a caravan of SCCCers following them on the freeway from San Fernando Valley to Rolling Hills, where the king of Southern California DXing had lived. I had goose pimples all over as I drove up in my vintage 1967 Mustang fastback. On my own turf, I felt like I was half a somebody. In Rolling Hills, I felt like an ant. Microscopic. A nobody visiting a god. Or at least ham radio heaven.

The station was well beyond anything I had imagined. Radios, wires, awards, certificates, pictures and oh yes, antennas galore. It was well beyond the most amazing amateur radio installation I had ever dreamed of. I was obviously in the ultimate DX station of all time. Most of us can only dream of having a rhombic antenna. Don had 14 of these things! 61 telephone poles supported his antennas, scattered around 120 acres. Another 110 poles carried the feed lines to the antennas. The installation dwarfed all other amateur radio installations.
