Auckland 670 IRLP node is on test.

There is currently an IRLP test being carried out on the 670 repeater. 670 may be connected to any other similarly equipped repeater in the world. To access the system send from your 2 metre radio a 4-digit DTMF tone to connect to another node. EG: 1649 (VE7OVY in Canada). Send DTMF 73 to disconnect.
